# Methodology

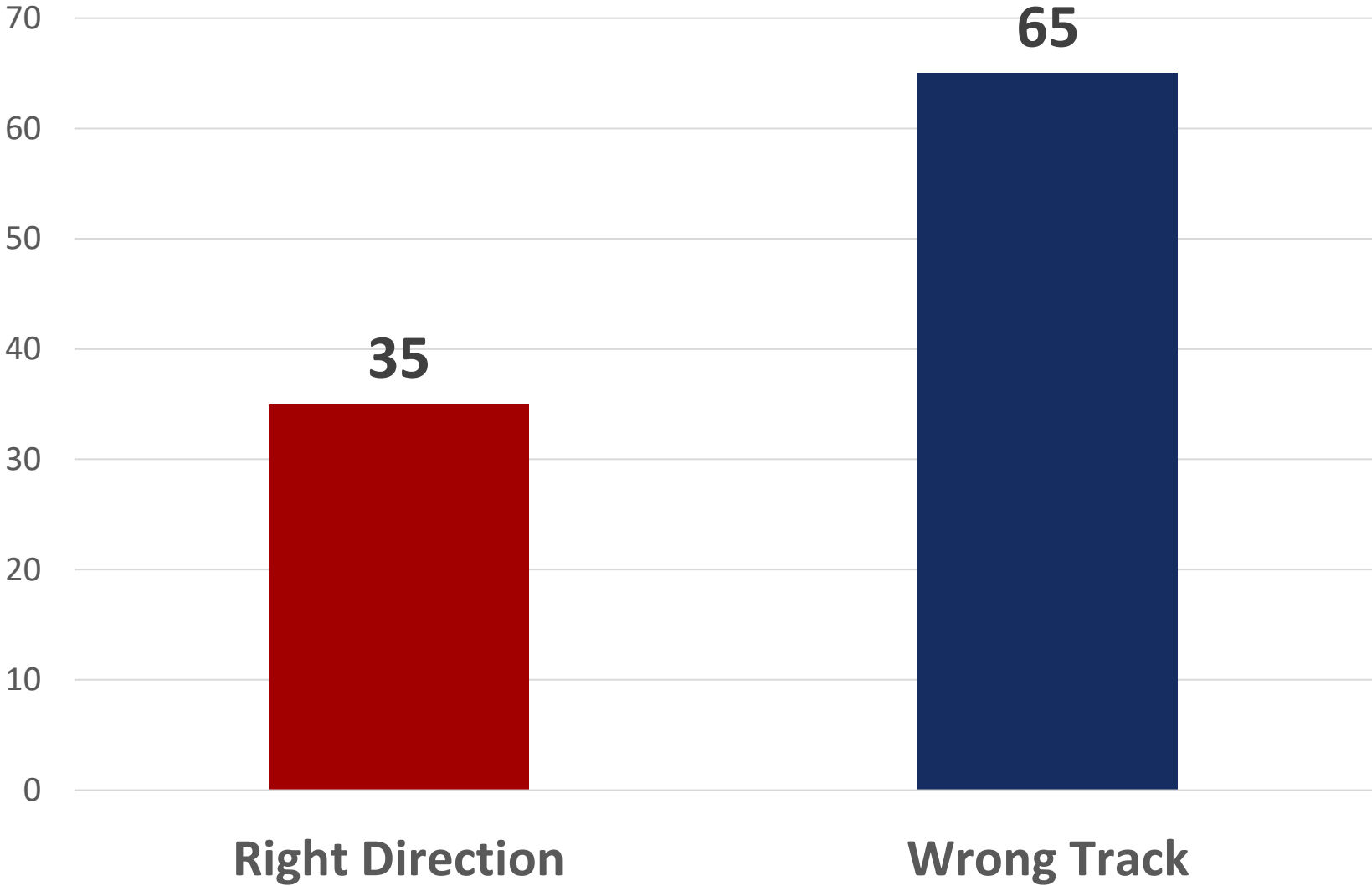
This national survey was conducted among 2,000 likely general election voters. All interviews were conducted online between May 9-14, 2022.

Online survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual voter turnout nationwide among swing voters.

The sample of 2,000 likely general election swing voters has an accuracy of +/- 2.2% at a 95% confidence interval. The numbers in this presentation have been rounded and may not equal 100%.

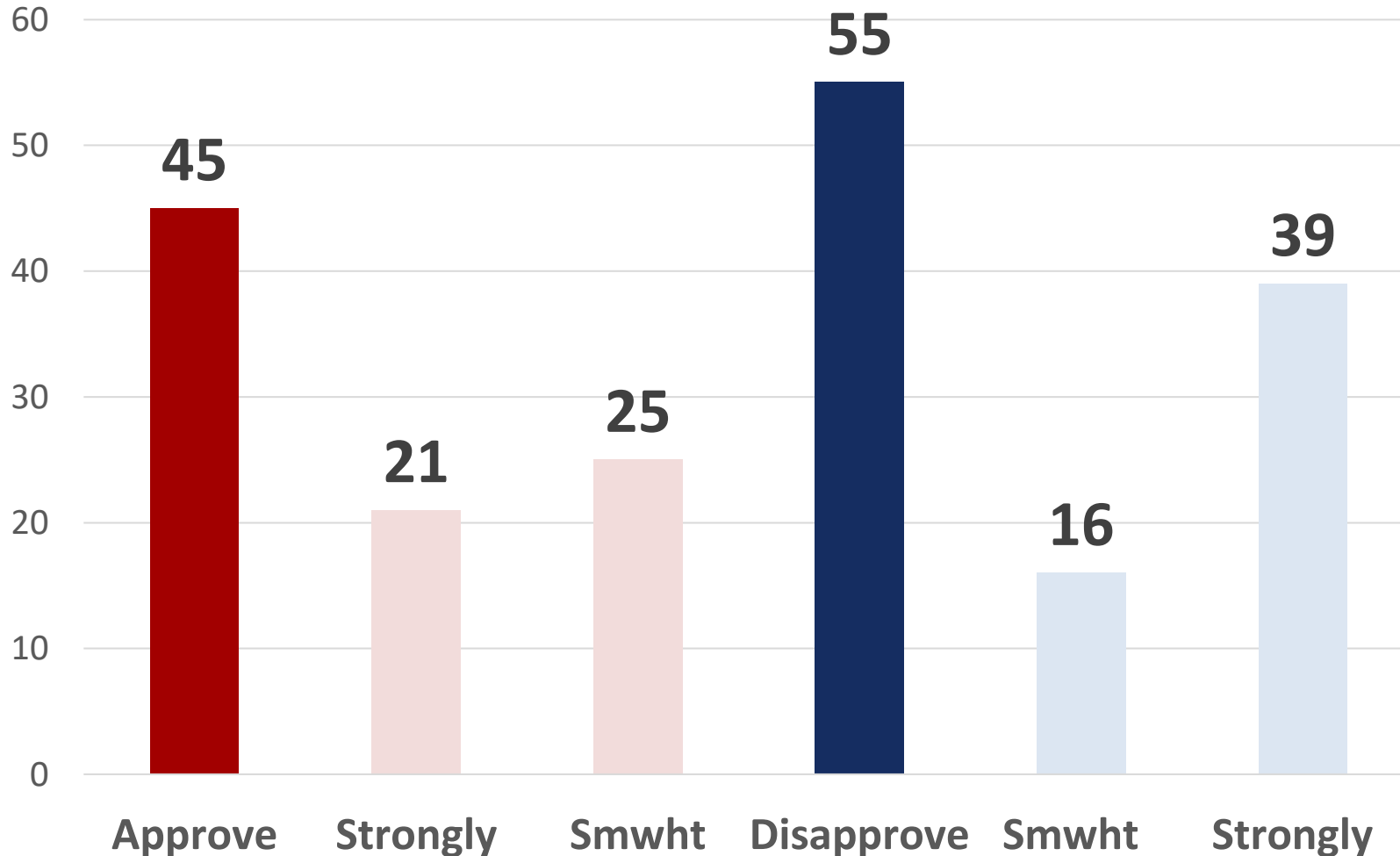


# Direction of the United States



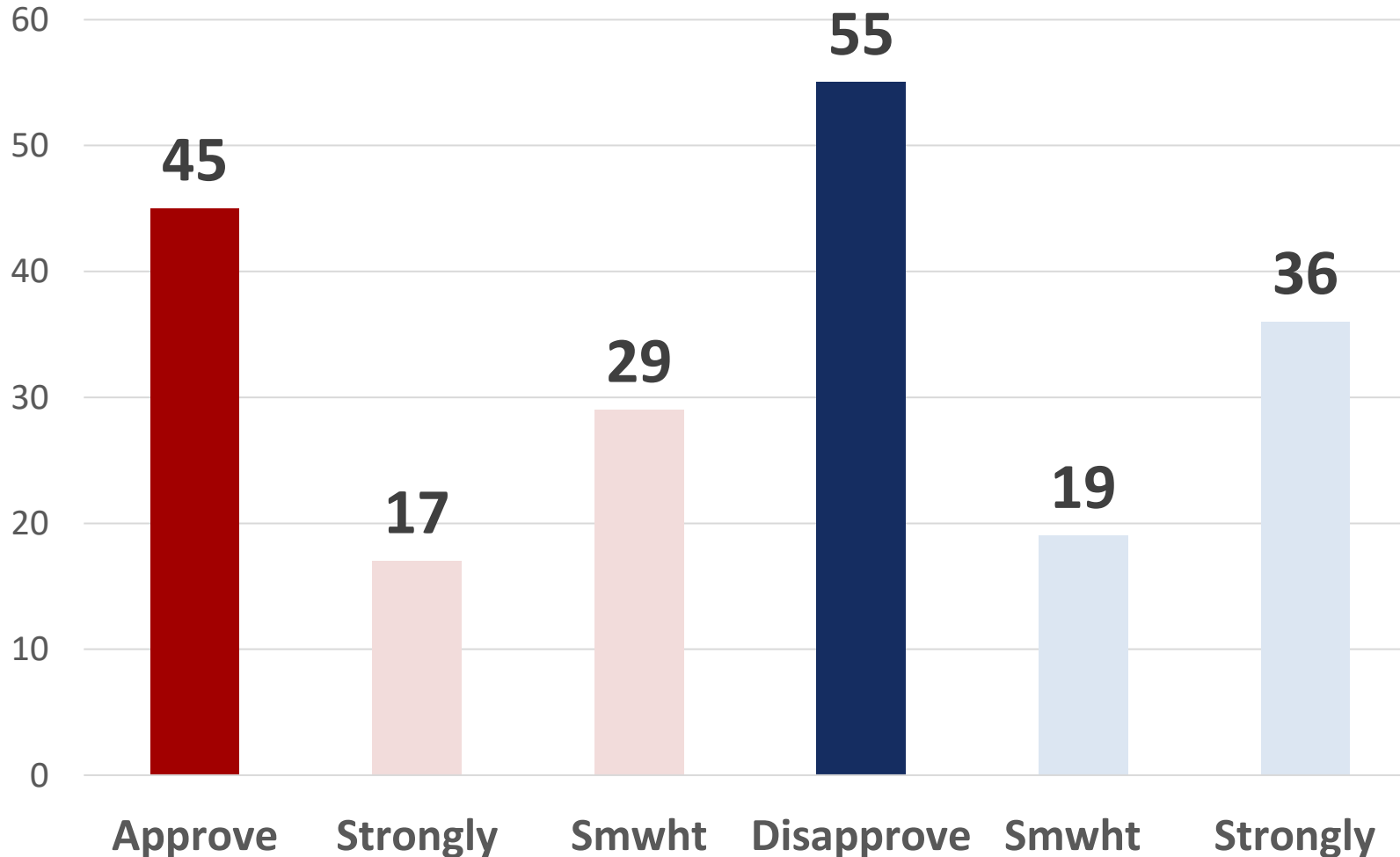
