Key Takeaways

- Most Americans are following news about the end of Title 42.

- A plurality agree that the situation at the border is due to the government's incompetence rather than done intentionally to serve political and corporate interests.

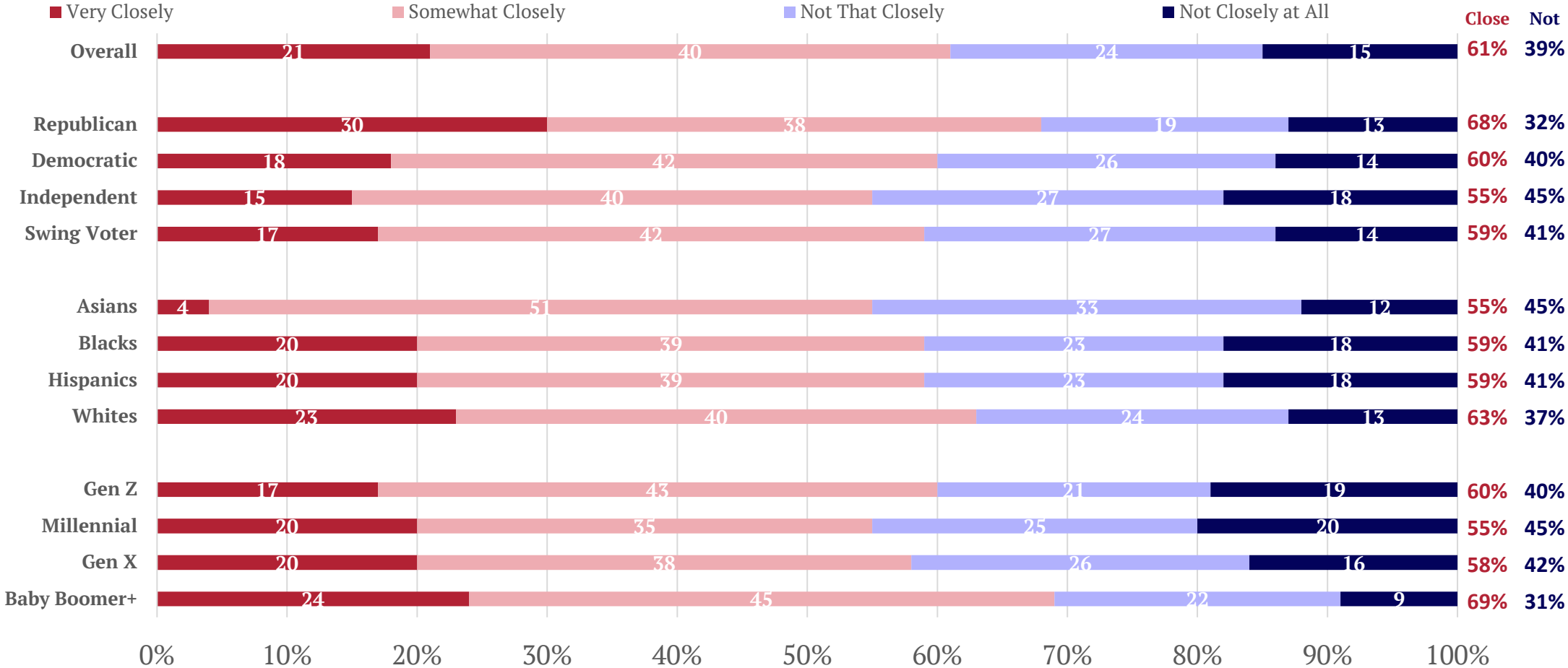
BOTTOM LINE – Declaring a State of Emergency over the border has strong support, which puts Biden in a bind, because doing so is an admission that there is a crisis.



Six in Ten Americans Are Following News About the End of Title 42

Baby Boomer+(69%) and Republicans (68%) are most likely to be following the news, but all groups report a majority.

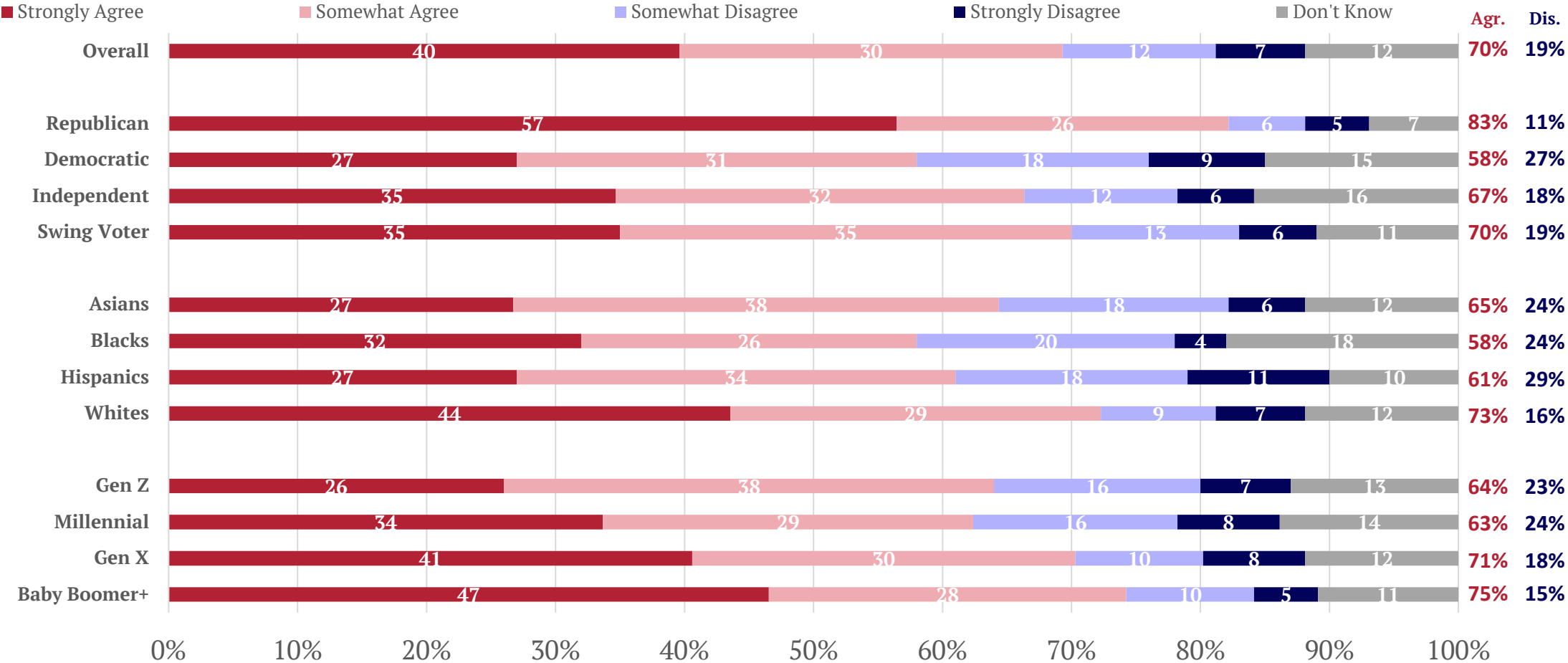
“How closely are you following news about the end of Title 42 – a COVID public health measure that was used in practice to help block entry of illegal immigrants into the county?”



Seven in Ten Support Declaring a State of Emergency to Help Border Towns Deal with the Migrant Crisis

Majorities of every group support declaring a state of emergency, including Hispanics (61%), Democrats (58%) , and Gen Z (64%).

“As you may know, the Mayor of Yuma, Arizona, a city of less than 100,000 people located near the Mexican border, recently wrote a letter to President Biden demanding the “declaration of a national state of emergency due to the immigration crisis at the southern border,” which would allow the deployment of FEMA and National Guard personnel to border communities. Do you agree or disagree that President Biden should declare a national state of emergency so that FEMA and National Guard can be mobilized to help border communities deal with the border crisis?”

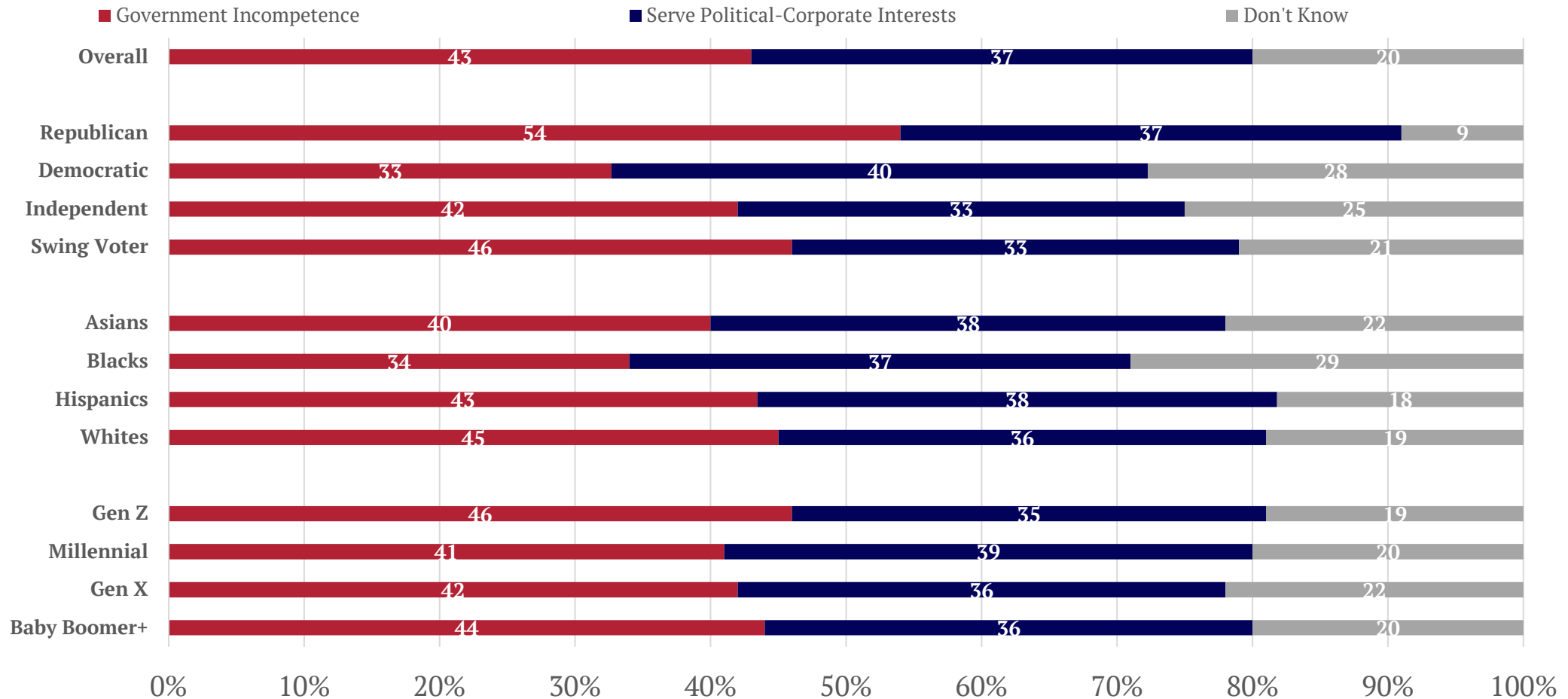


Voters Split on Whether The Border Situation is Due to Incompetence or Done Deliberately

Republicans had the strongest opinions, while around 1 in 5 of other demographics said they didn't know.

1. The situation at the border is due to the government's incompetence.
2. The situation at the border is done deliberately to serve political and corporate interests.

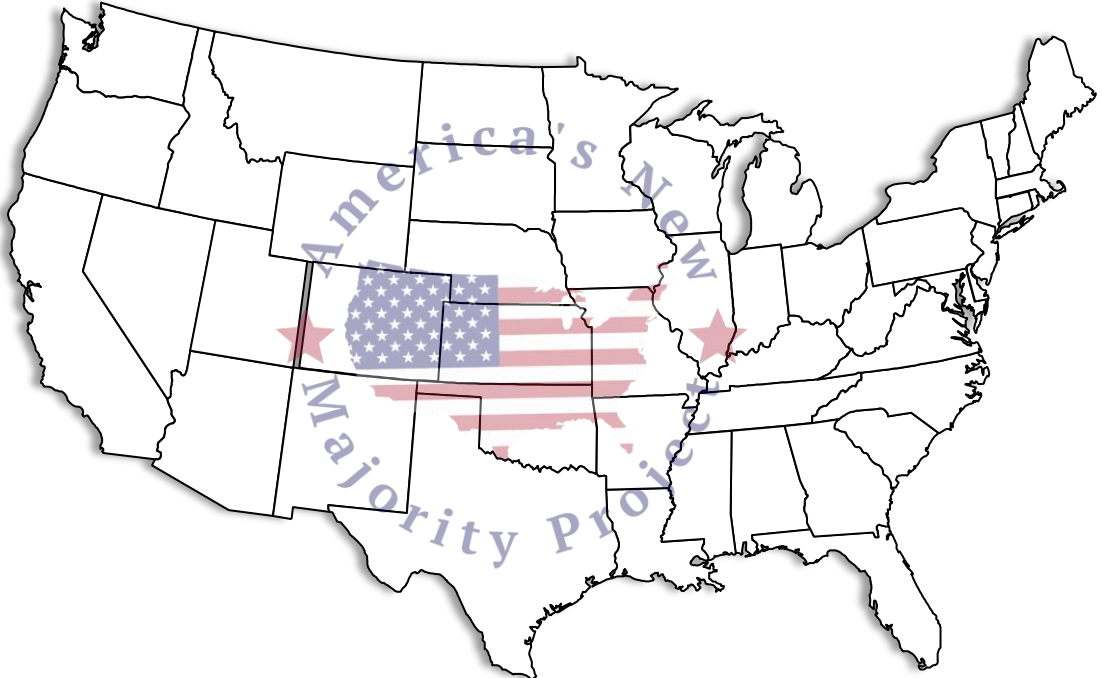


Methodology

Mclaughlin & Associates partnered with Gingrich360 to conduct a national survey for America's New Majority Project. This national survey was conducted among 2,000 likely general election voters between May 18-21, 2023.

All interviews were conducted online. Survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual general election turnout.

The sample of 2,000 likely general election voters has an accuracy of +/- 2.2% at a 95% confidence interval. The numbers in this presentation have been rounded and may not equal 100%.
