






VOTER UNIVERSE – JULY 13-16, 2023

Screener survey of 13 questions, asking respondents to rank agreement on 0-10 scale, identified 72% of American voters as part of America's New Majority.

■ Left Minority








EVERY DEMOGRAPHIC GROUP EXCEPT DEMOCRATS BELIEVE U.S. IS ON THE WRONG TRACK

VOTERS IN NEW MAJORITY OVERWHELMINGLY BELIEVE AMERICA IS ON THE WRONG TRACK




"Do you approve or disapprove of the job Joe Biden is doing as President?"





ONLY BLACKS (+31) AND GEN Z (+3) APPROVE OF THE JOB JOE BIDEN IS DOING AS PRESIDENT


"Do you approve or disapprove of the job Joe Biden is doing as President?"



GOP REACHES NEW HIGH AMONG LIKELY VOTERS




"If the election for U.S. Congress in your district were held today, would you vote for the Republican candidate or the Democratic candidate?"






GOP HAS 12-POINT LEAD WITH SWING VOTERS








GOP HAS 46-POINT LEAD AMONG VOTERS IN AMERICA'S NEW MAJORITY

Methodology

Mclaughlin & Associates partnered with Gingrich360 to conduct a national survey for America's New Majority Project. This national survey was conducted among 2,000 likely general election voters between June 22-25, 2023.

All interviews were conducted online. Survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual general election turnout.

The sample of 2,000 likely general election voters has an accuracy of +/- 2.2% at a 95% confidence interval. The numbers in this presentation have been rounded and may not equal 100%.
