# KEY TAKEAWAYS

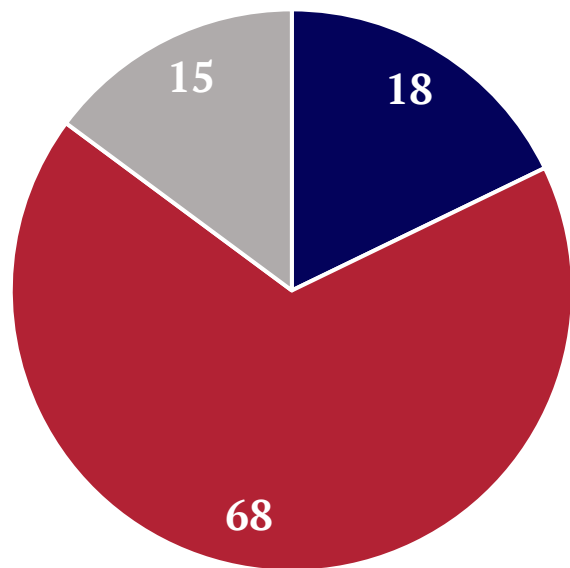
- A large majority of Americans say terrorism is caused more by terrorist ideology than Israeli or U.S. policy.
- Majorities or pluralities of Americans agree that key sentiments expressed by anti-Israel and pro-Palestinian politicians and protesters are antisemitic.
- However, there are significant differences in agreement by age, with younger voters much more likely than other groups to defend anti-Israel and pro-Palestinian positions.
- There are smaller but meaningful differences by party, ideology, and race – with more liberal and black voters more likely to defend anti-Israel and pro-Palestinian positions.

# MOST BLAME TERRORIST IDEOLOGY MORE THAN U.S. OR ISRAELI POLICY FOR TERRORISM

There is a significant age divide, with younger voters more likely to blame Israeli and U.S. policies than older voters.

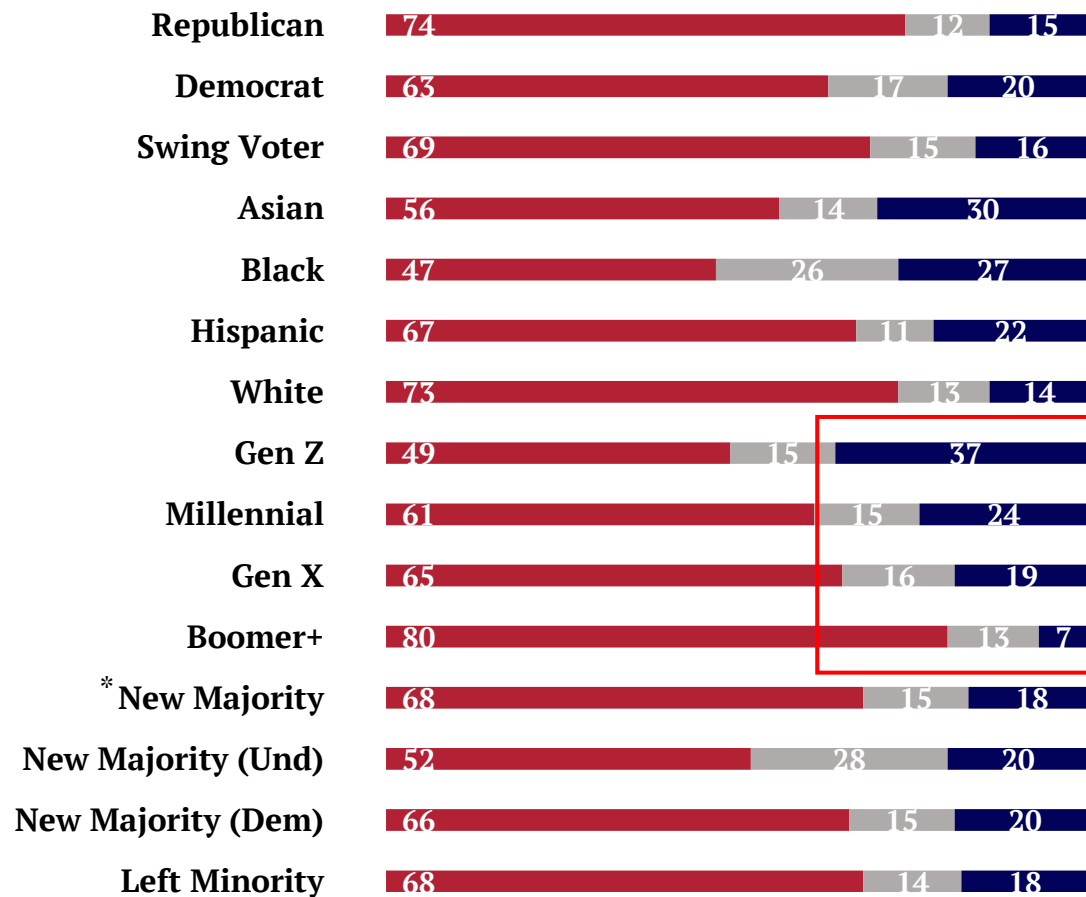
Would you say terrorism against Israel and the United States is caused more by:

\*New Majority voters are determined through a screener survey of statements, asking respondents to rank their agreement on a 0 to 10 scale, as well as the intensity of their approval of the president and party preference on the generic ballot. New Maj (Und) are those who are on the generic ballot, New Maj (Dem) are those who are leaning toward a Democrat but show affinity for New Majority messaging.

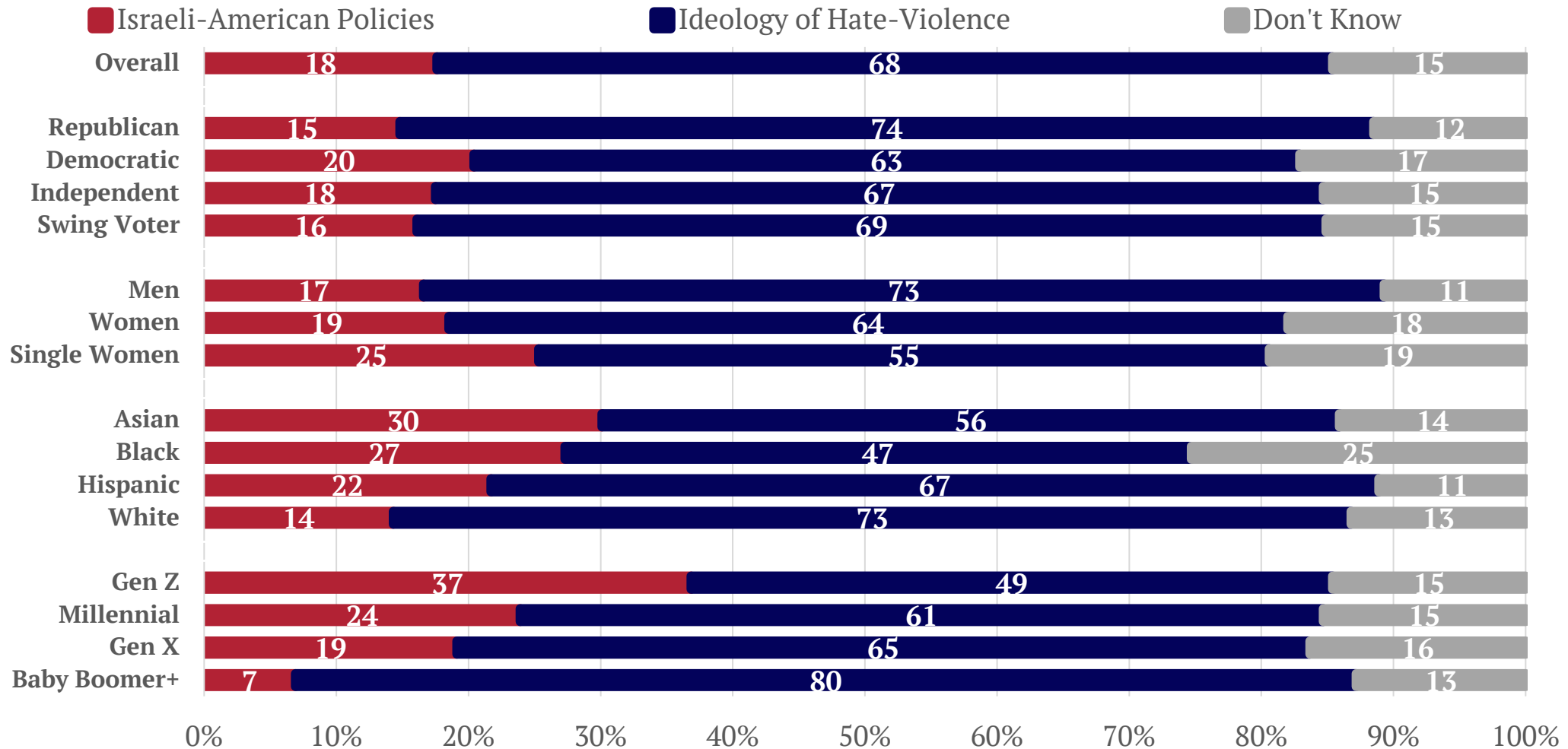

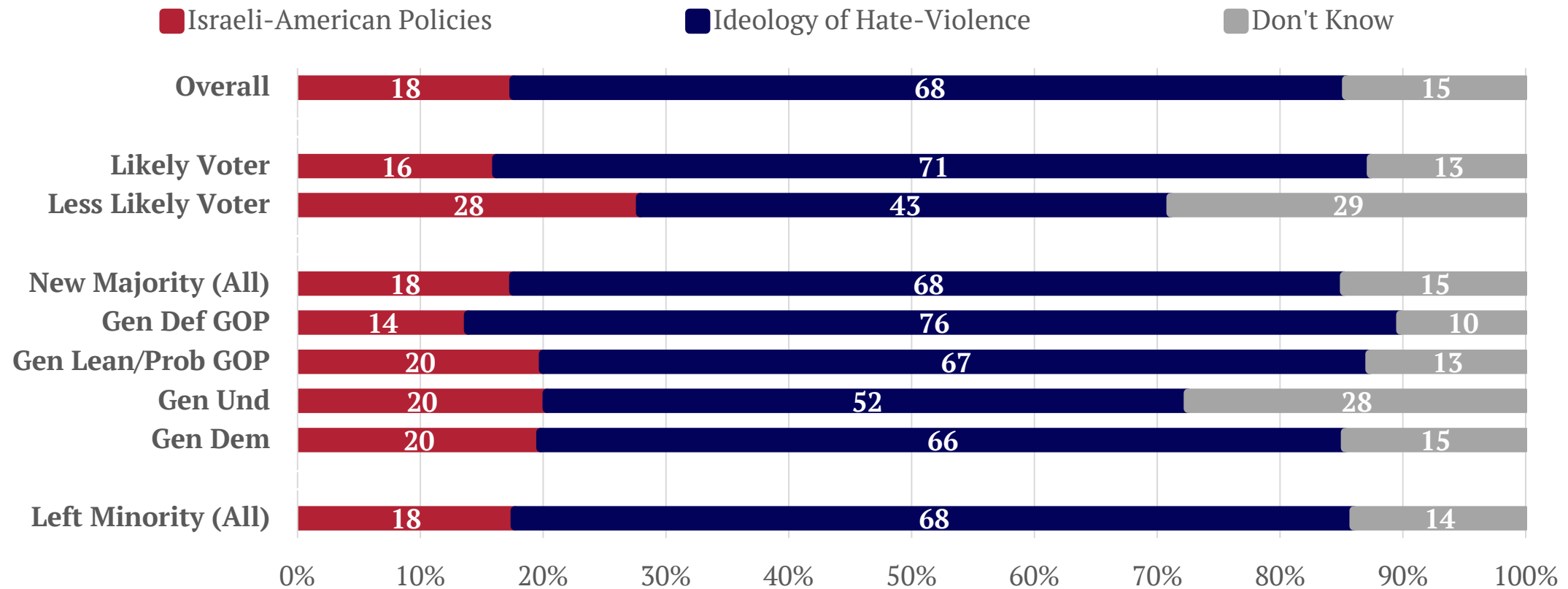


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# AMERICANS MORE DIVIDED ON WHETHER BLAMING ISRAEL FOR THE HAMAS ATTACKS IS ANTISEMITIC

Largest divide is by age, with younger voters much less likely to say anti-Israel rhetoric is antisemitic. Black and Asian voters also less likely to consider anti-Israel rhetoric antisemitic.

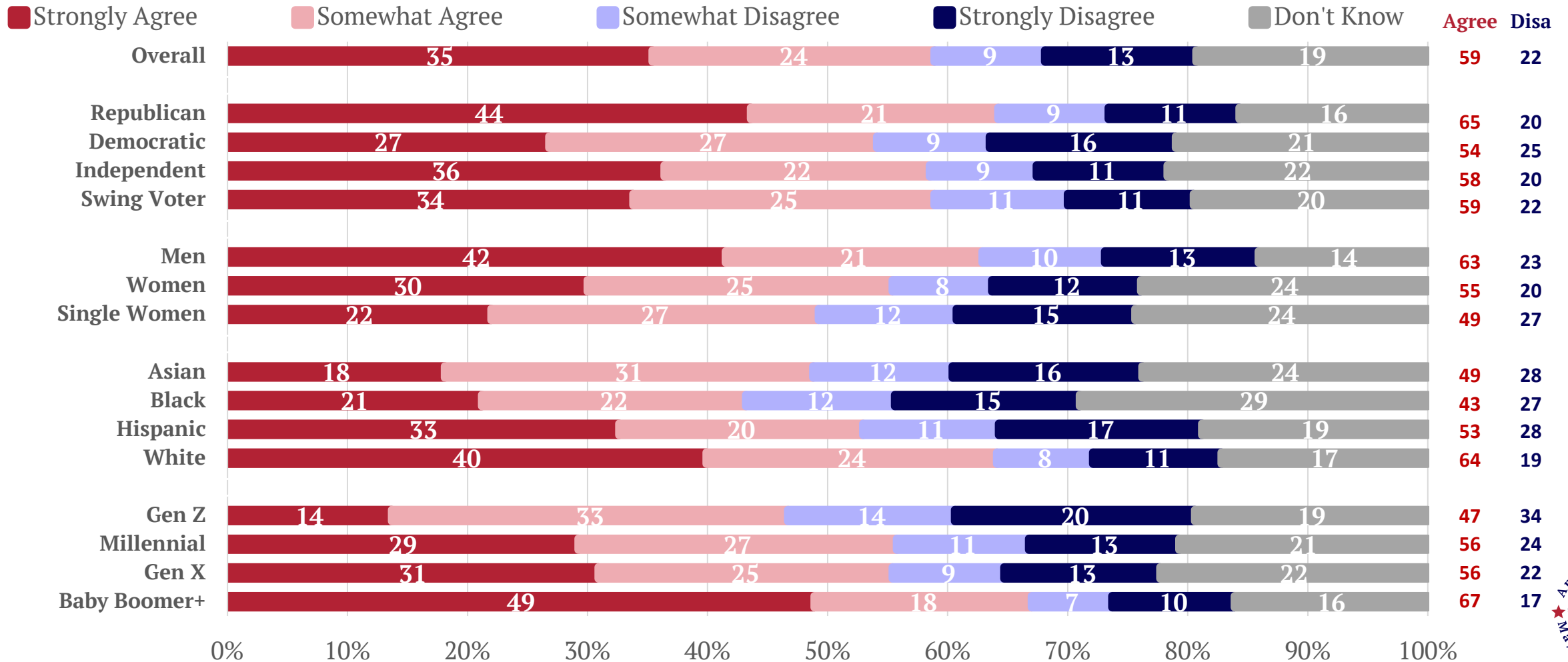

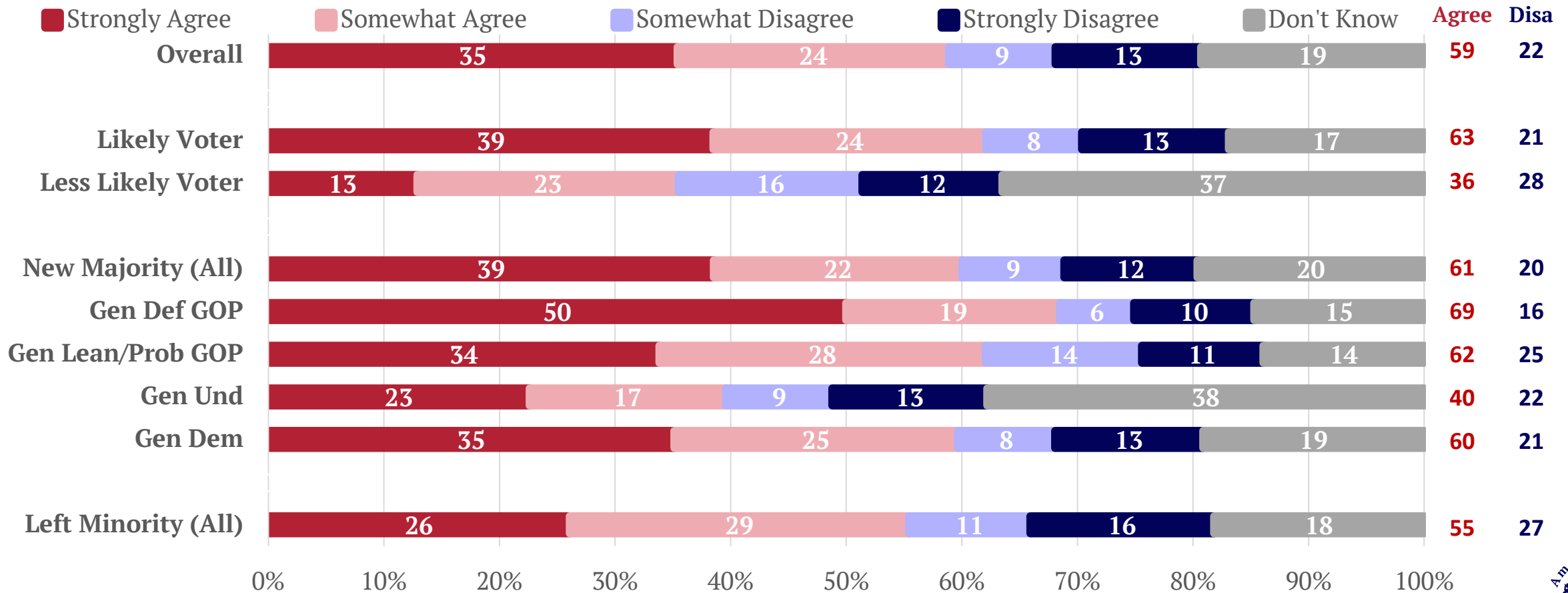

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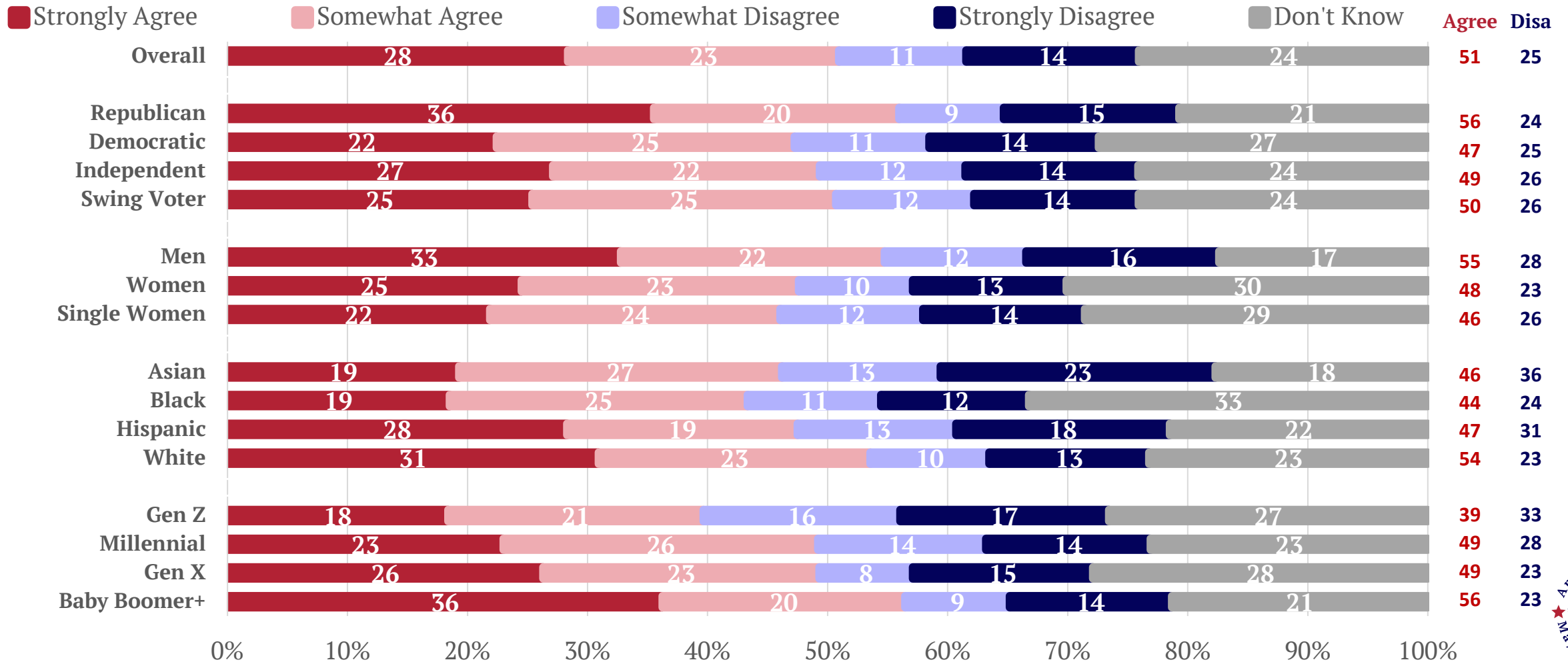

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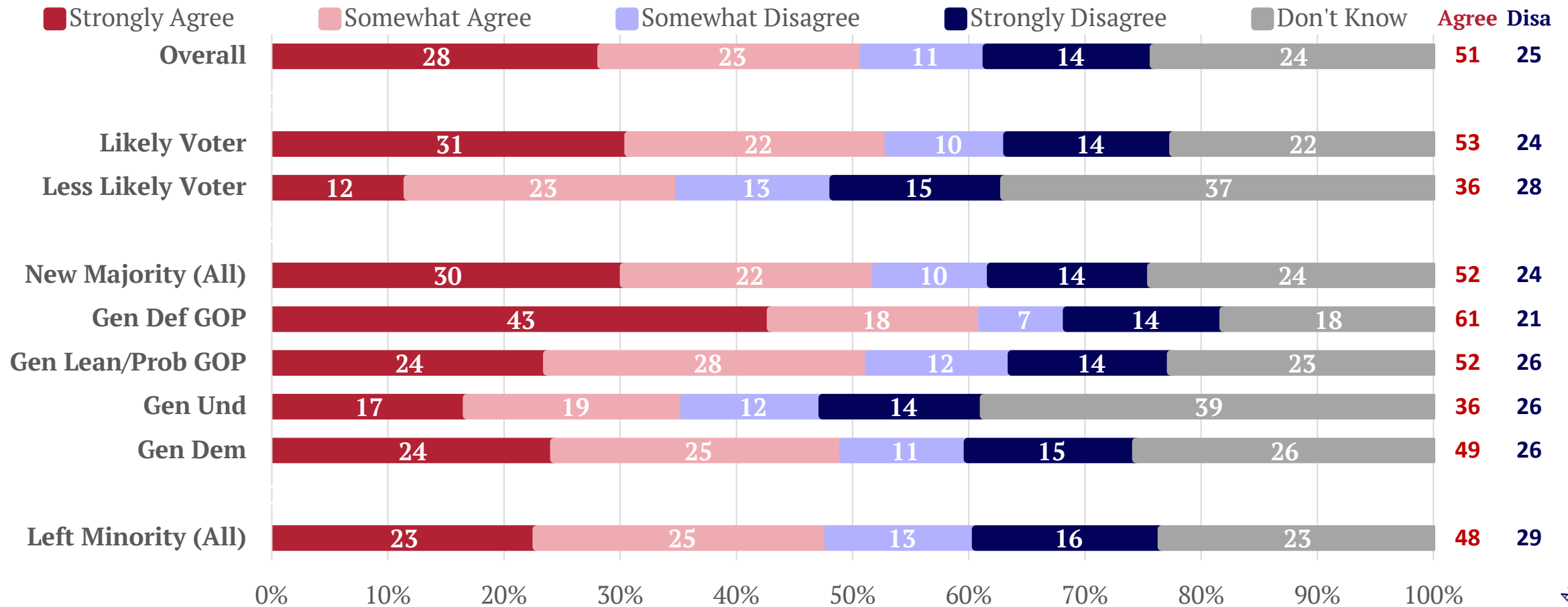

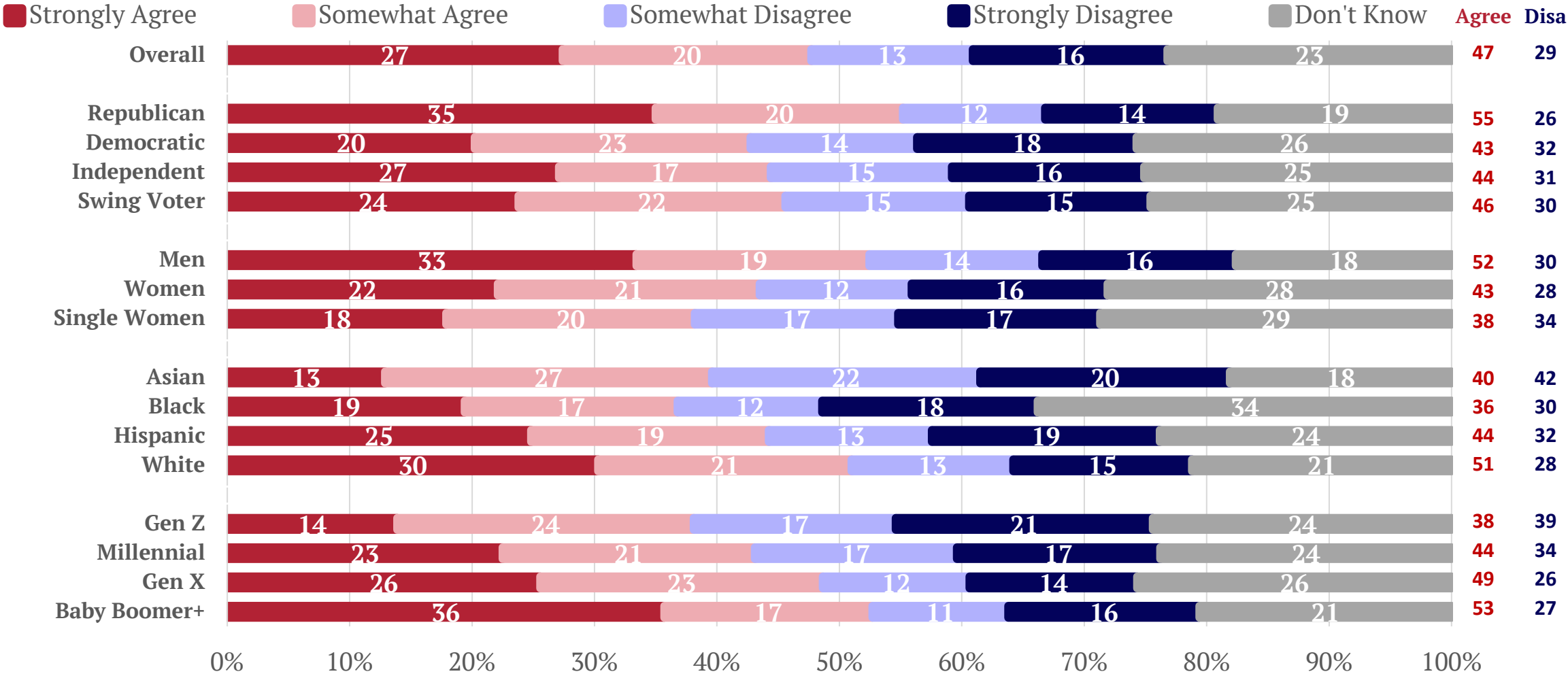

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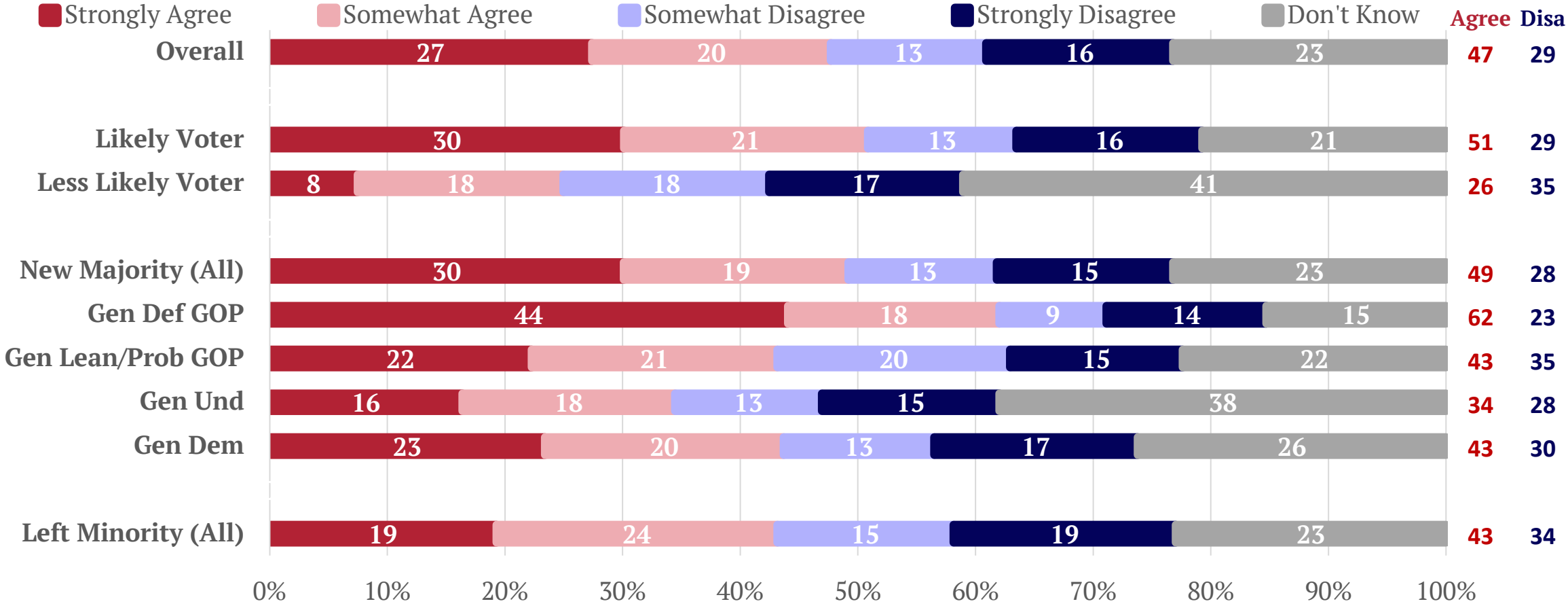

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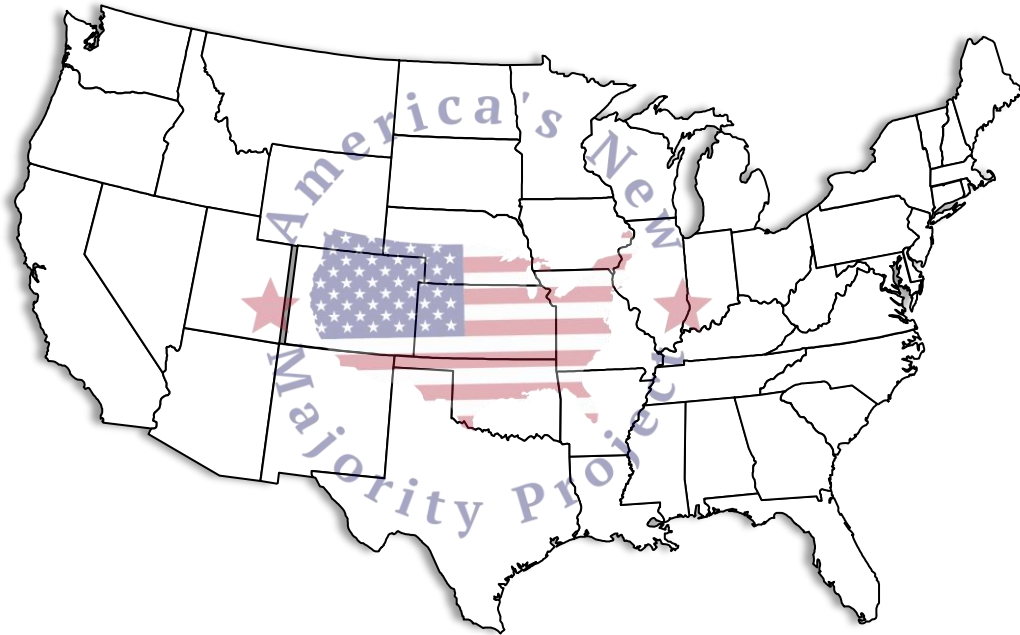


# Methodology

Mclaughlin & Associates partnered with Gingrich360 to conduct a national survey for America's New Majority Project. This national survey was conducted among 2,000 registered voters between October 19-22, 2023.

All interviews were conducted online. Survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual general election turnout.

The sample of 2,000 registered voters has an accuracy of +/- 2.2% at a 95% confidence interval. The numbers in this presentation have been rounded and may not equal 100%.
