
KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Americans narrowly support aid to Israel but are divided by age, race and gender.
- Ukraine aid is narrowly opposed by Americans, with sharp divisions by party.

- Voting on separate bills and insisting on spending offsets to pay for additional aid to Israel, Ukraine, and other emergency security priorities are magnet issues that attract New Majority voters.




6-IN-10 VOTERS SAY CONGRESS SHOULD VOTE SEPARATELY ON DIFFERENT FUNDING REQUESTS

MAGNET – KEY NEW MAJORITY GROUPS FAVOR SEPARATE SECURITY SPENDING BILLS




Americans are divided by age, race and gender on funding to help Israel in their war against Hamas.

"Do you support or oppose Congress authorizing \$14.3 billion dollars in aid to Israel to assist in their war against Hamas?"




NEW MAJORITY VOTERS NARROWLY DIVIDED ON AID TO ISRAEL

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
VOTERS PREFER ISRAEL AID BE PAID FOR WITH SPENDING CUTS, NOT MORE BORROWING

"If the \$14.3 billion dollars in aid to Israel is authorized, what is the best way for Congress to pay for it?"




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
HALF OF ALL VOTERS WOULD PREFER ISRAEL AID NOT PASS THAN BORROW TO PAY FOR IT


KEY NEW MAJORITY GROUPS SAY DON'T PASS ISRAEL AID AT ALL IF IT MEANS MORE BORROWING

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
VOTERS NARROWLY OPPOSE MORE AID TO UKRAINE – LARGE PARTISAN DIVIDE

LARGE DIVIDE BETWEEN NEW MAJORITY AND LEFT MINORITY VOTERS ON UKRAINE AID

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


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INDEPENDENTS & SWING VOTERS PREFER UKRAINE AID NOT PASS IF IT REQUIRES DEFICIT SPENDING



Large difference between Undecided and Dem leaning New Majority voters and Left Minority voters.


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GOP CANDIDATE WHO SUPPORTS OFFSETS TO PAY FOR FOREIGN AID SPENDING GAINS 5 POINTS

1. A Republican candidate who says additional aid to foreign countries should be paid for with spending cuts elsewhere.





3 OF 5 POINTS GAINED BY GOP CANDIDATE FAVORING OFFSETS COMES FROM NEW MAJORITY

Methodology

Mclaughlin & Associates partnered with Gingrich360 to conduct a national survey for America's New Majority Project. This national survey was conducted among 2,000 registered voters between November 3-6, 2023.

All interviews were conducted online. Survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual general election turnout.

The sample of 2,000 registered voters has an accuracy of +/- 2.2% at a 95% confidence interval. The numbers in this presentation have been rounded and may not equal 100%.
