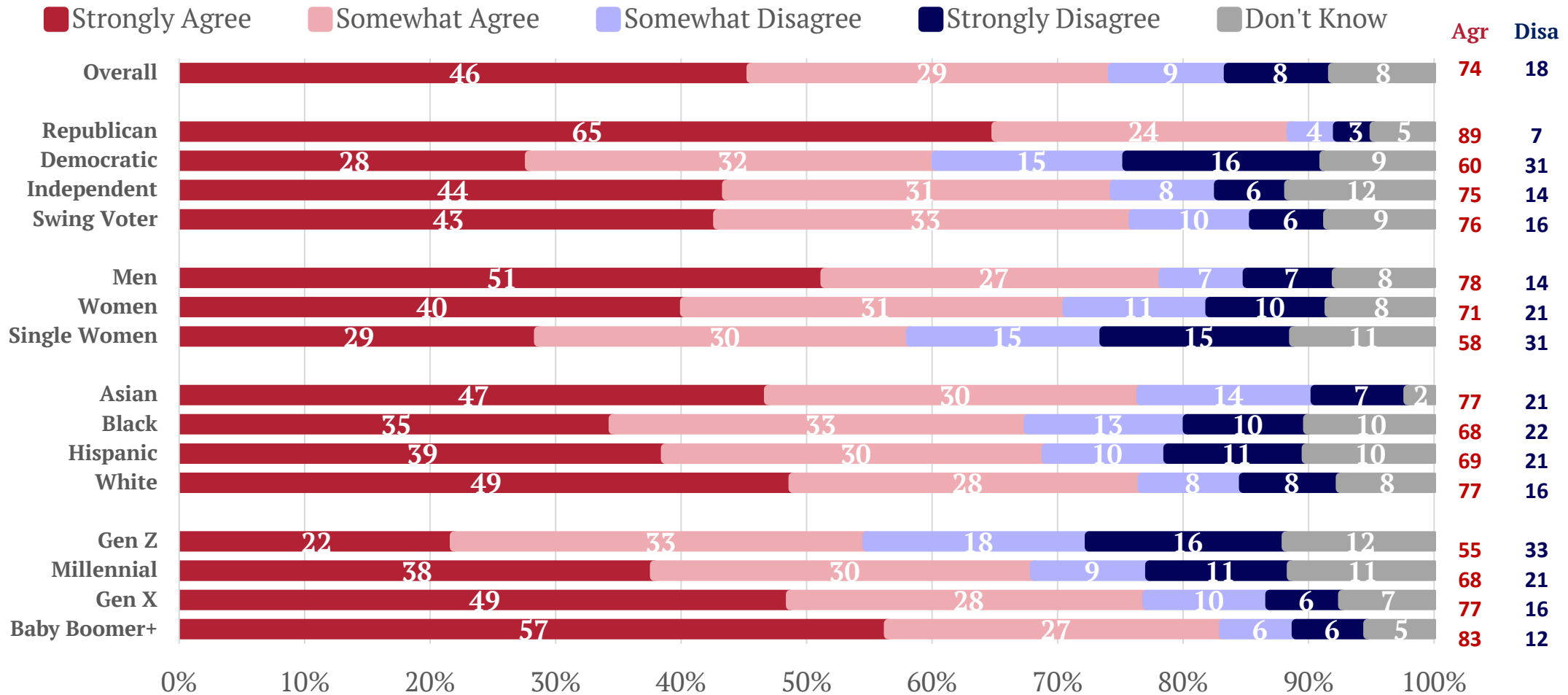
KEY TAKEAWAYS

- About 75% of voters agree the U.S. should prioritize border security and stopping illegal immigration before addressing the status of illegal immigrants already in the country.
- Two-thirds of voters are in favor of laws that simplify the deportation of illegal immigrants back to their home countries.
- Almost 60% of voters support the idea of stopping automatic citizenship for children born in the U.S. to non-citizen or legal immigrant parents.
- Just over half of voters support changing census procedures to stop counting illegal immigrants and making it more difficult for illegal immigrants to find jobs and send money abroad.

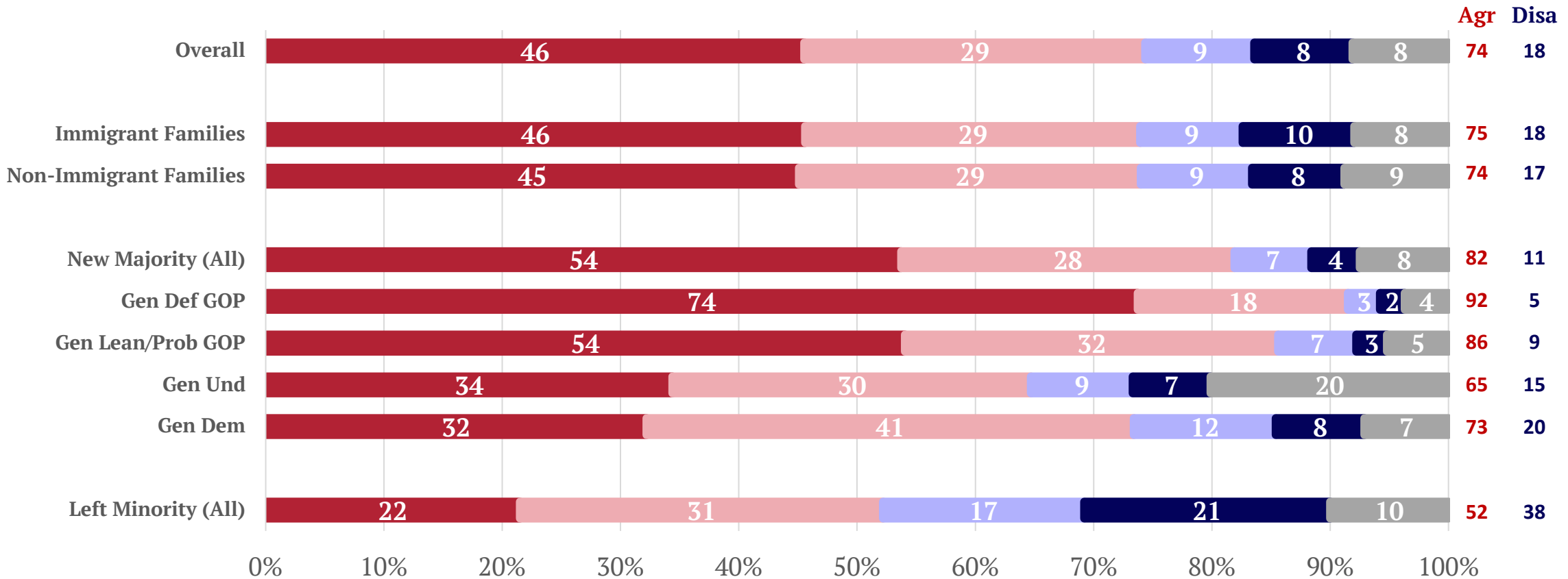

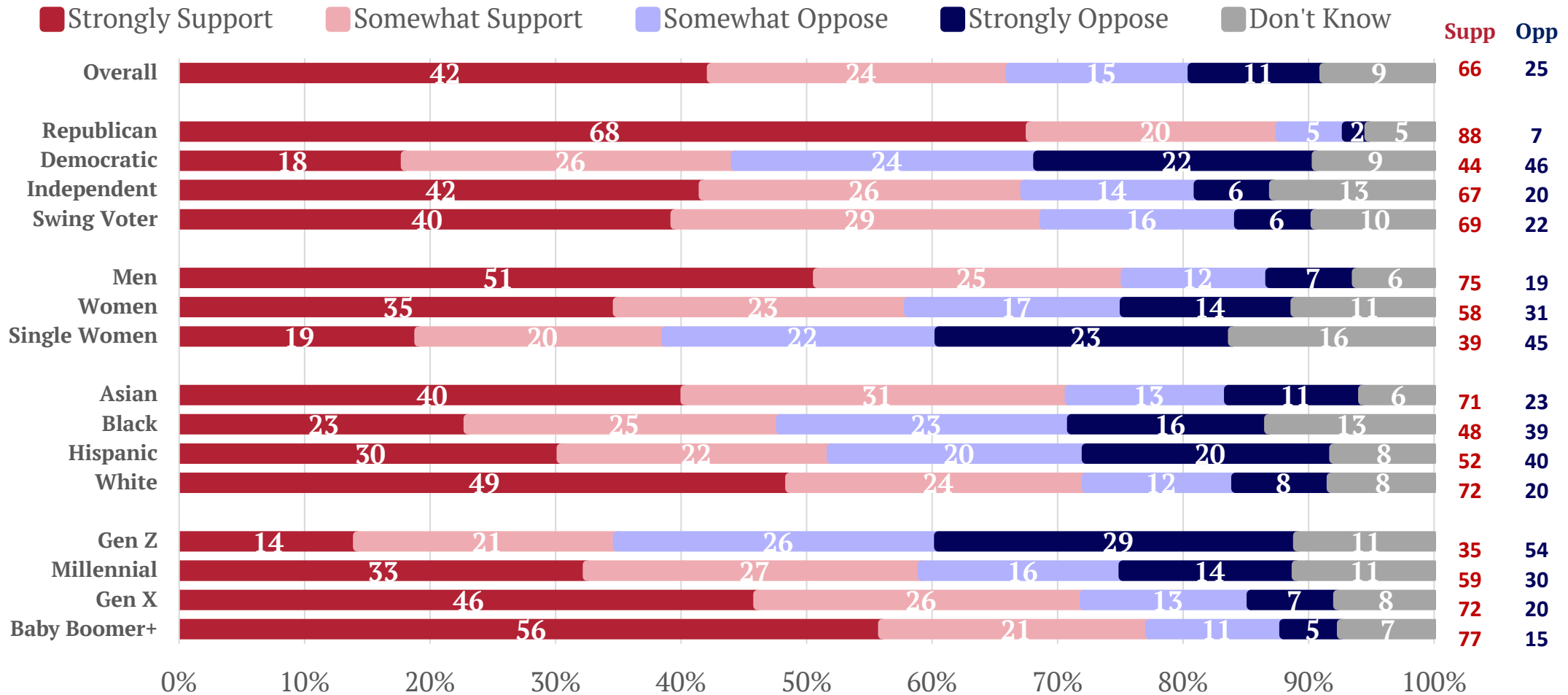

2-IN-3 VOTERS SUPPORT MAKING IT EASIER TO DEPORT ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS

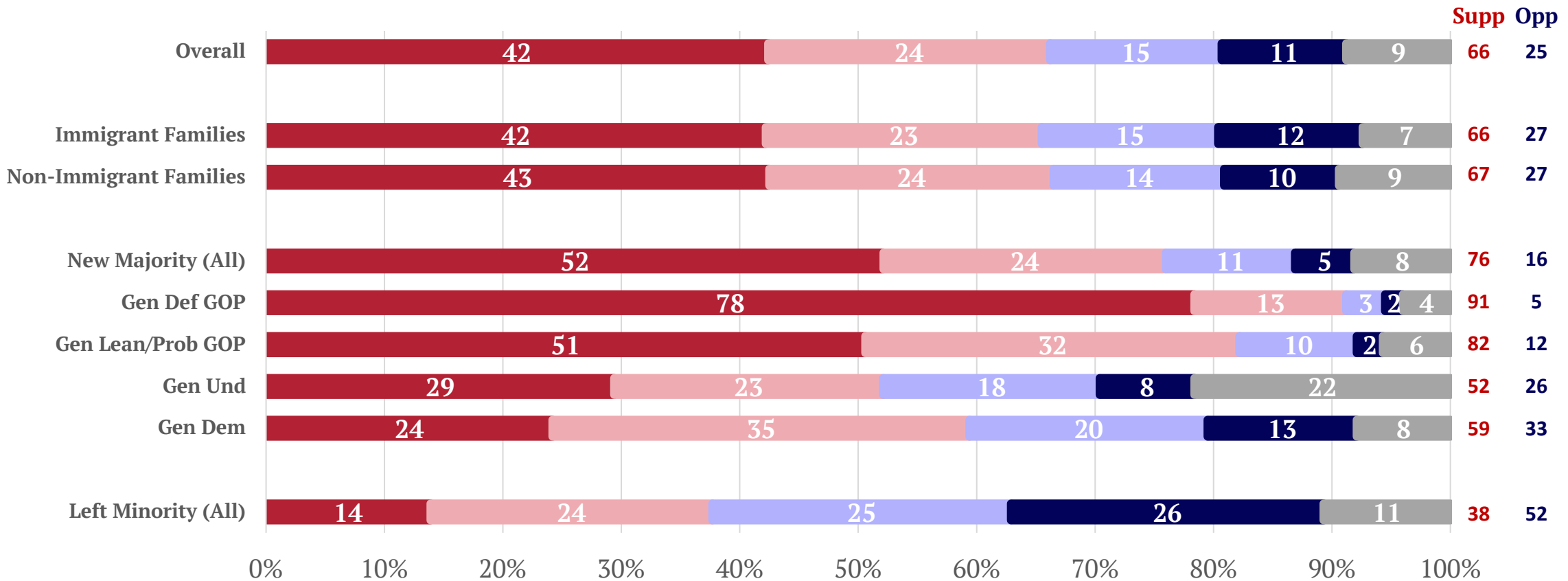

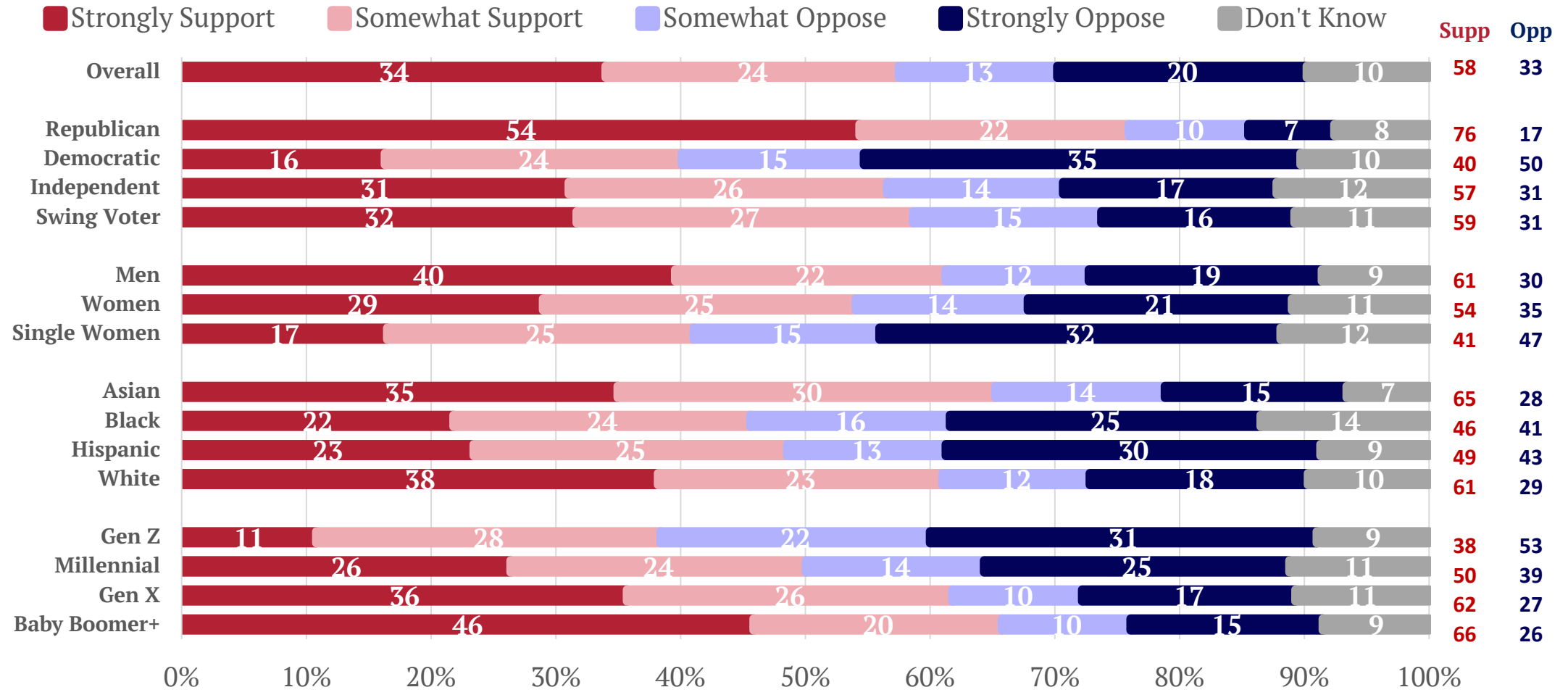

NEARLY 6-IN-10 SUPPORT ENDING BIRTHRIGHT CITIZENSHIP

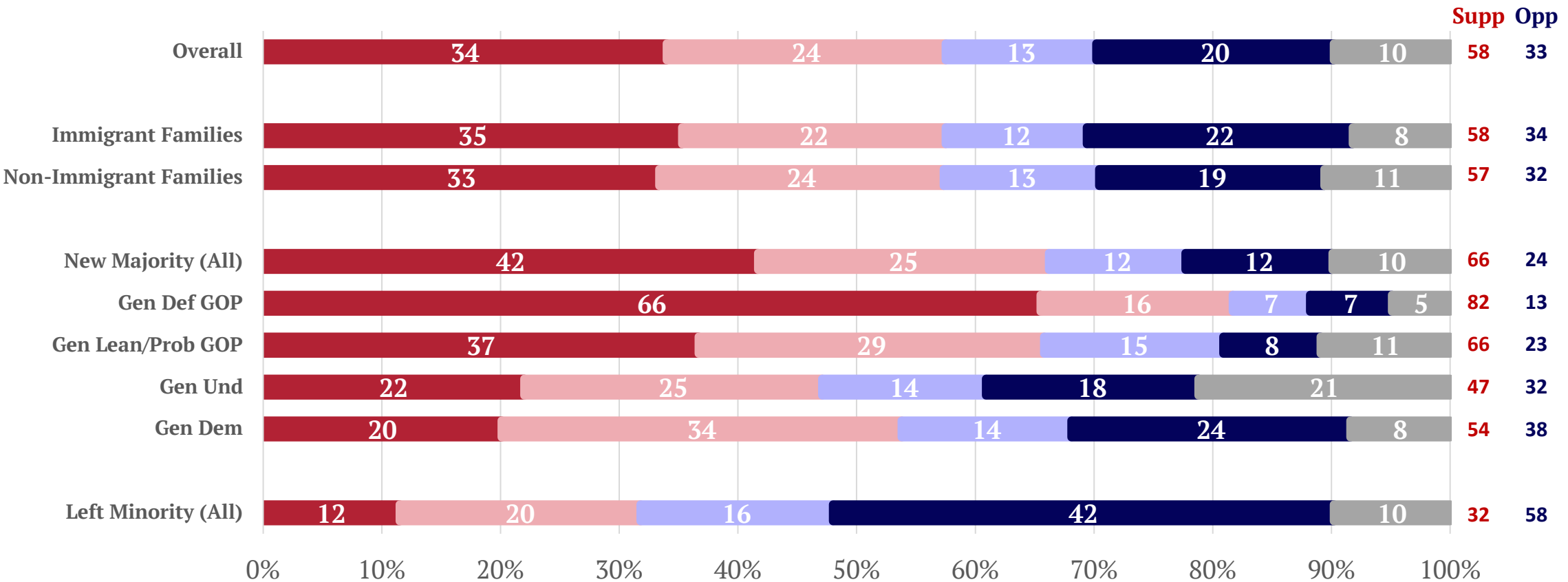

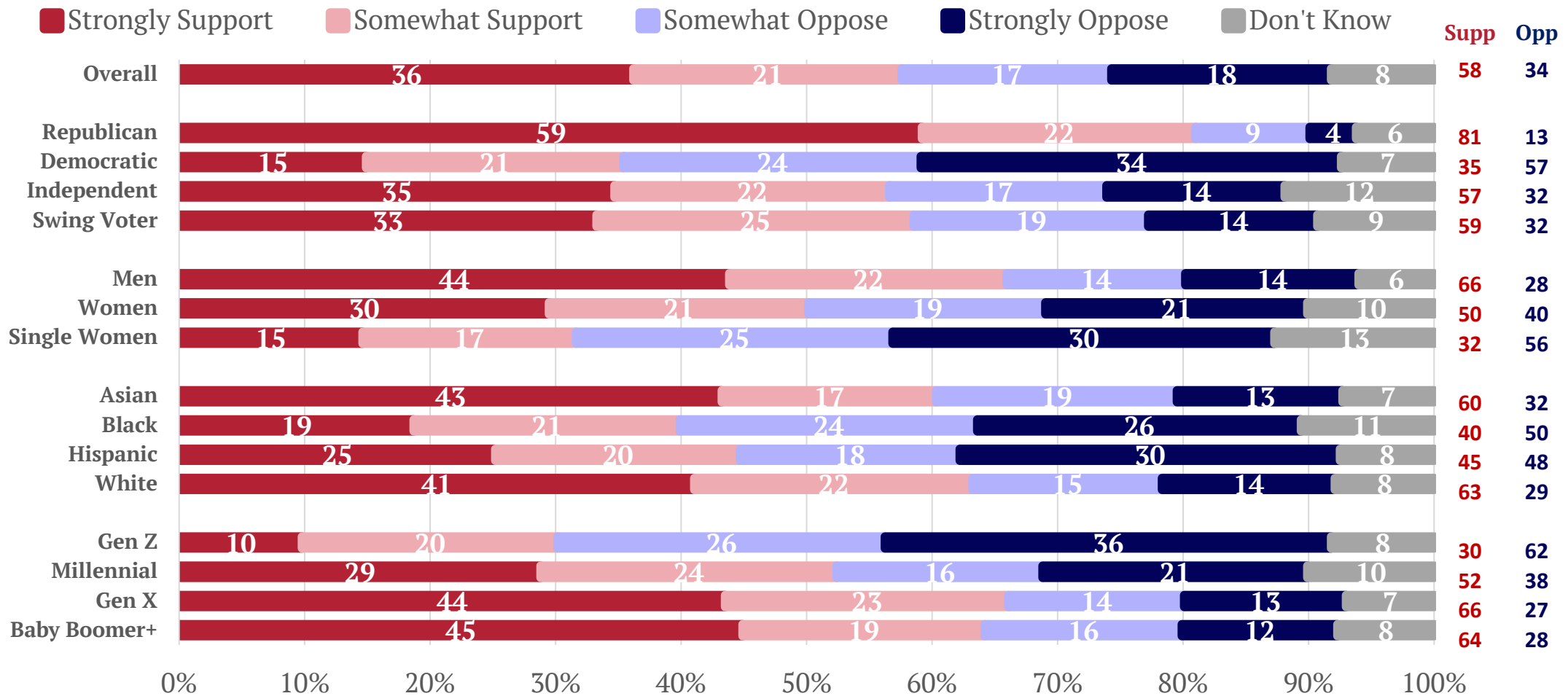

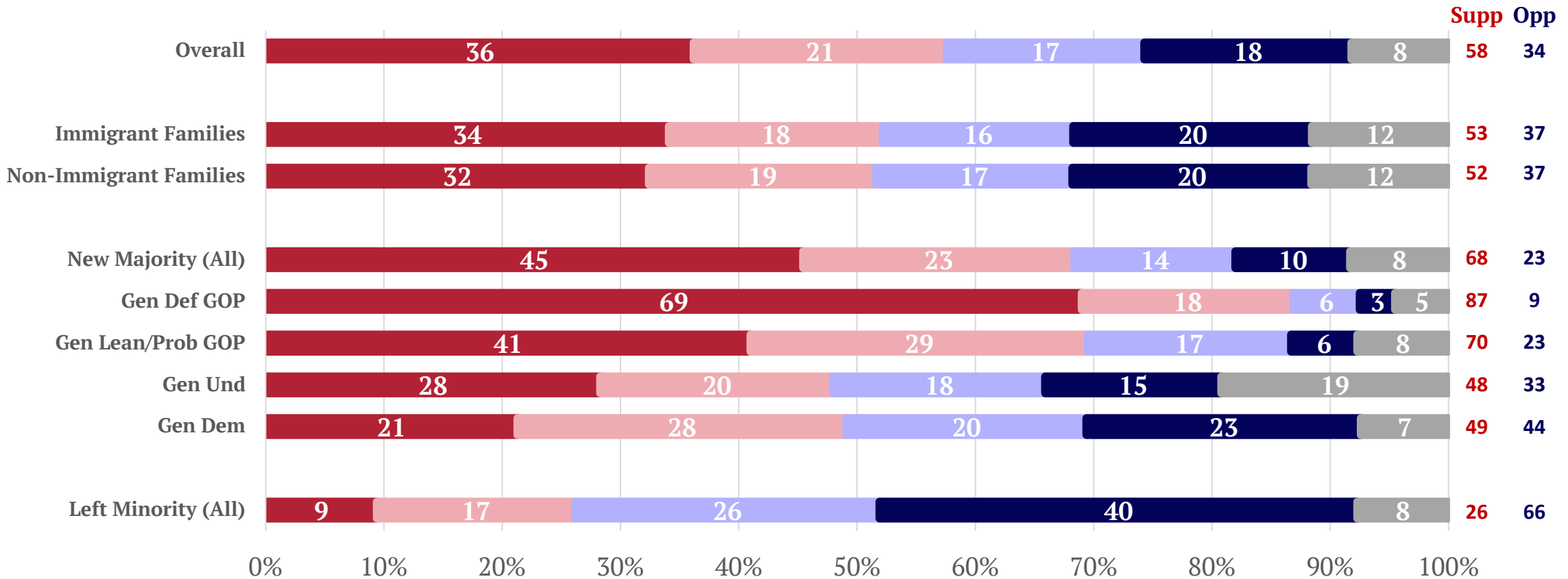

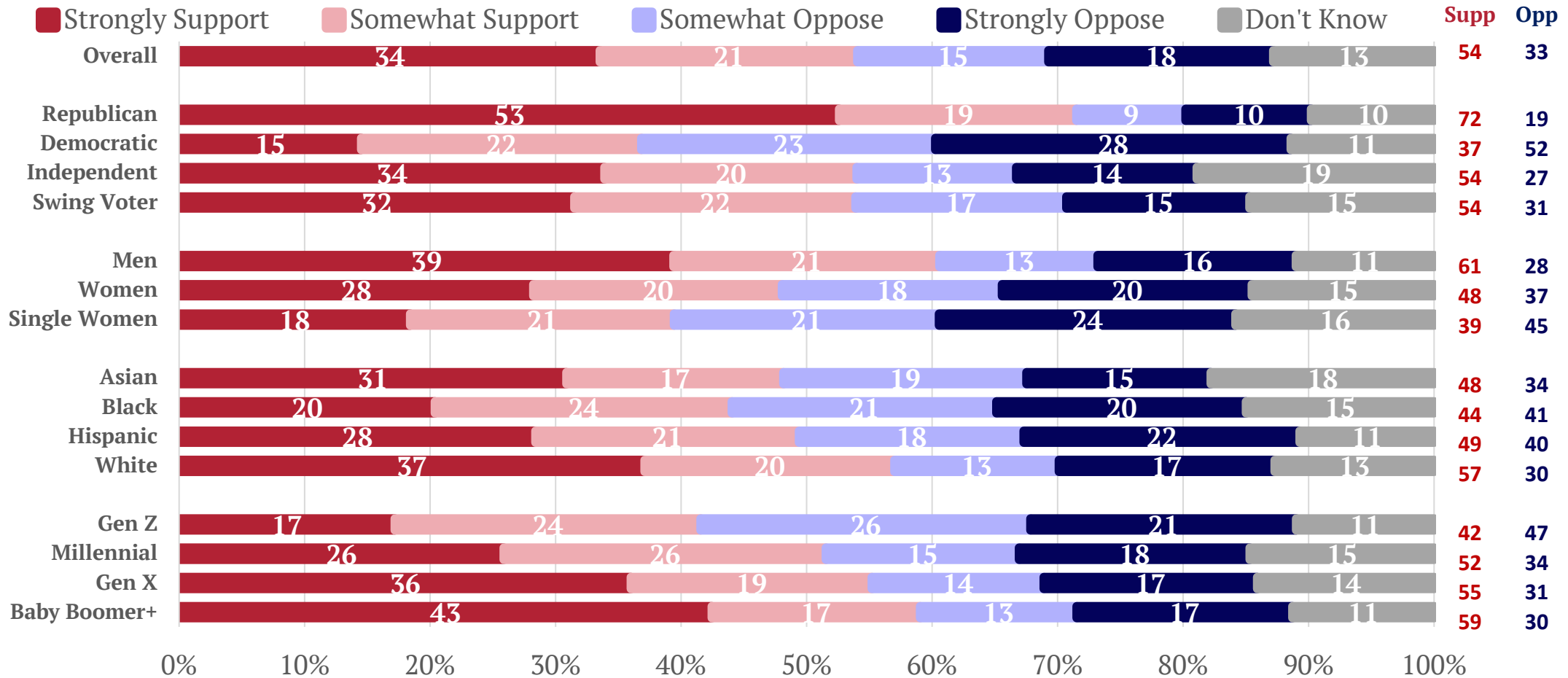

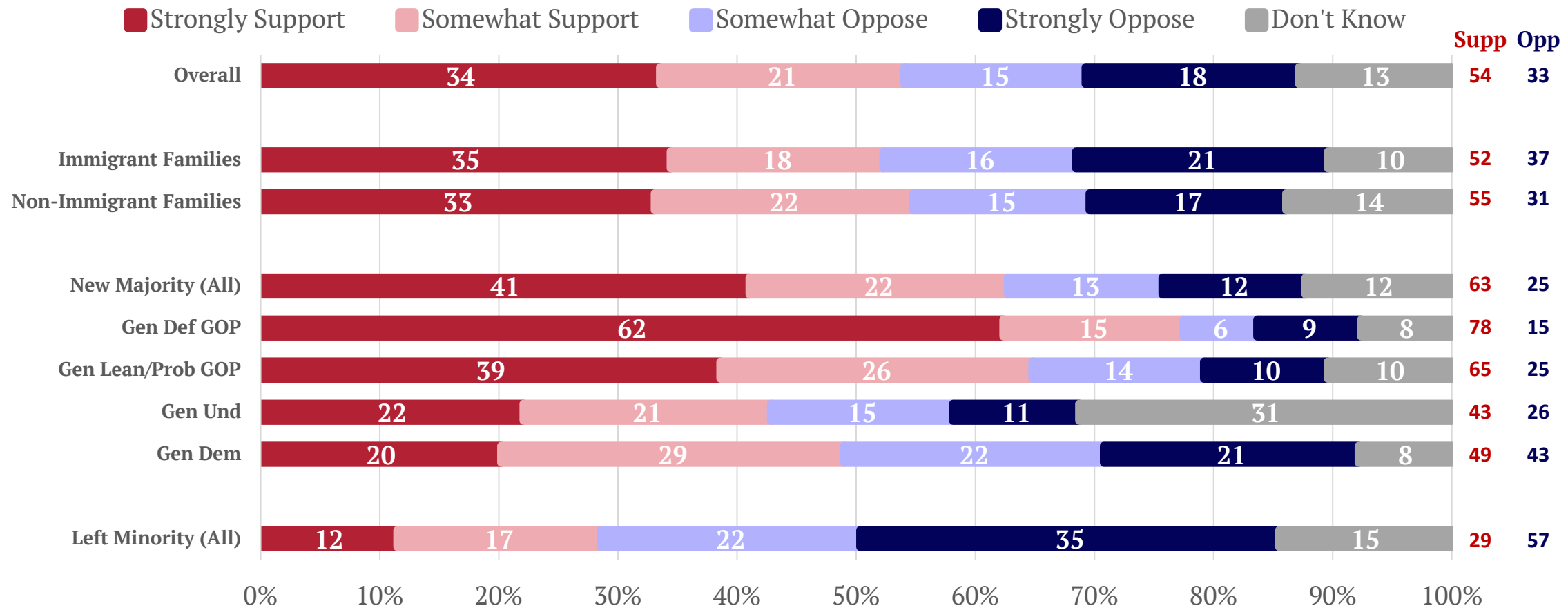
MODEST SUPPORT FOR NOT COUNTING ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS IN CENSUS

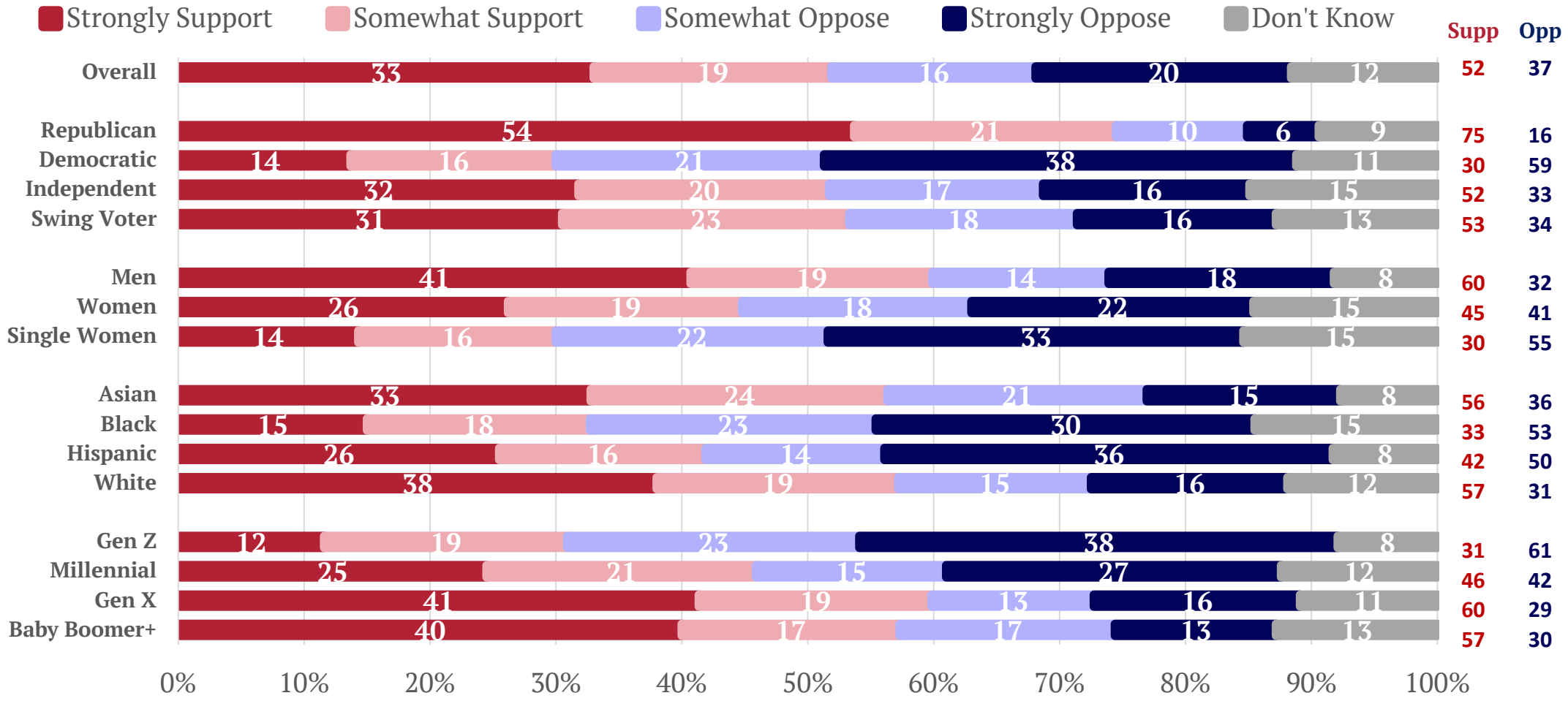

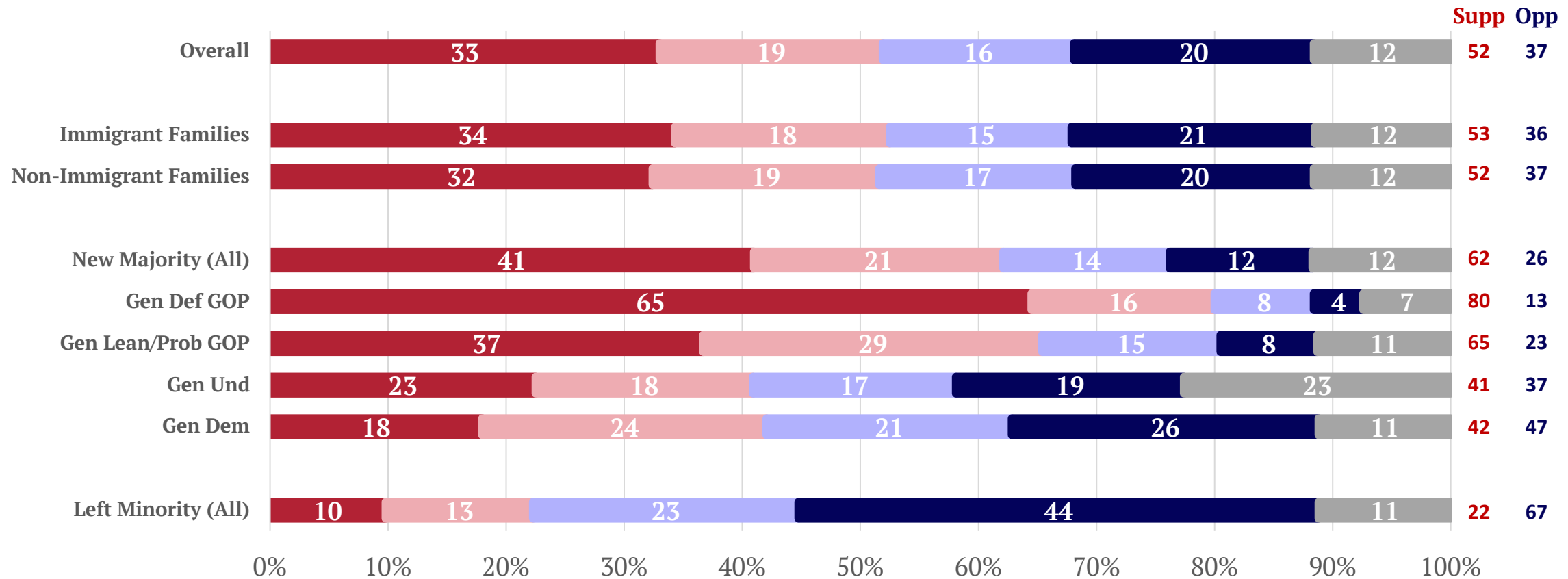

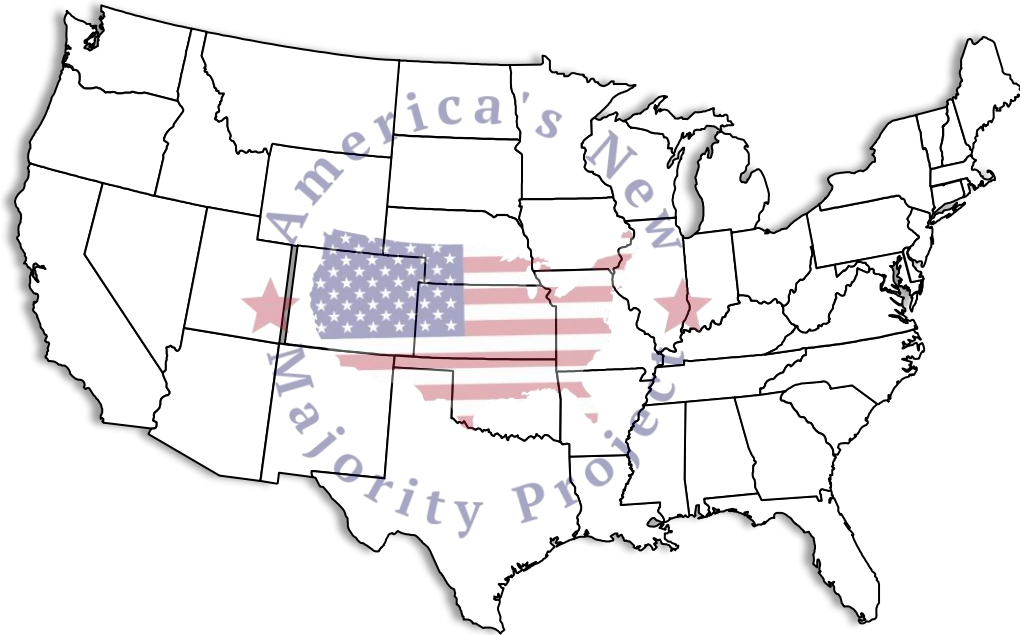


Methodology

Mclaughlin & Associates partnered with Gingrich360 to conduct a national survey for America's New Majority Project. This national survey was conducted among 2,000 registered voters between January 25-28, 2024.

All interviews were conducted online. Survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual general election turnout.

The sample of 2,000 registered voters has an accuracy of +/- 2.2% at a 95% confidence interval. The numbers in this presentation have been rounded and may not equal 100%.
