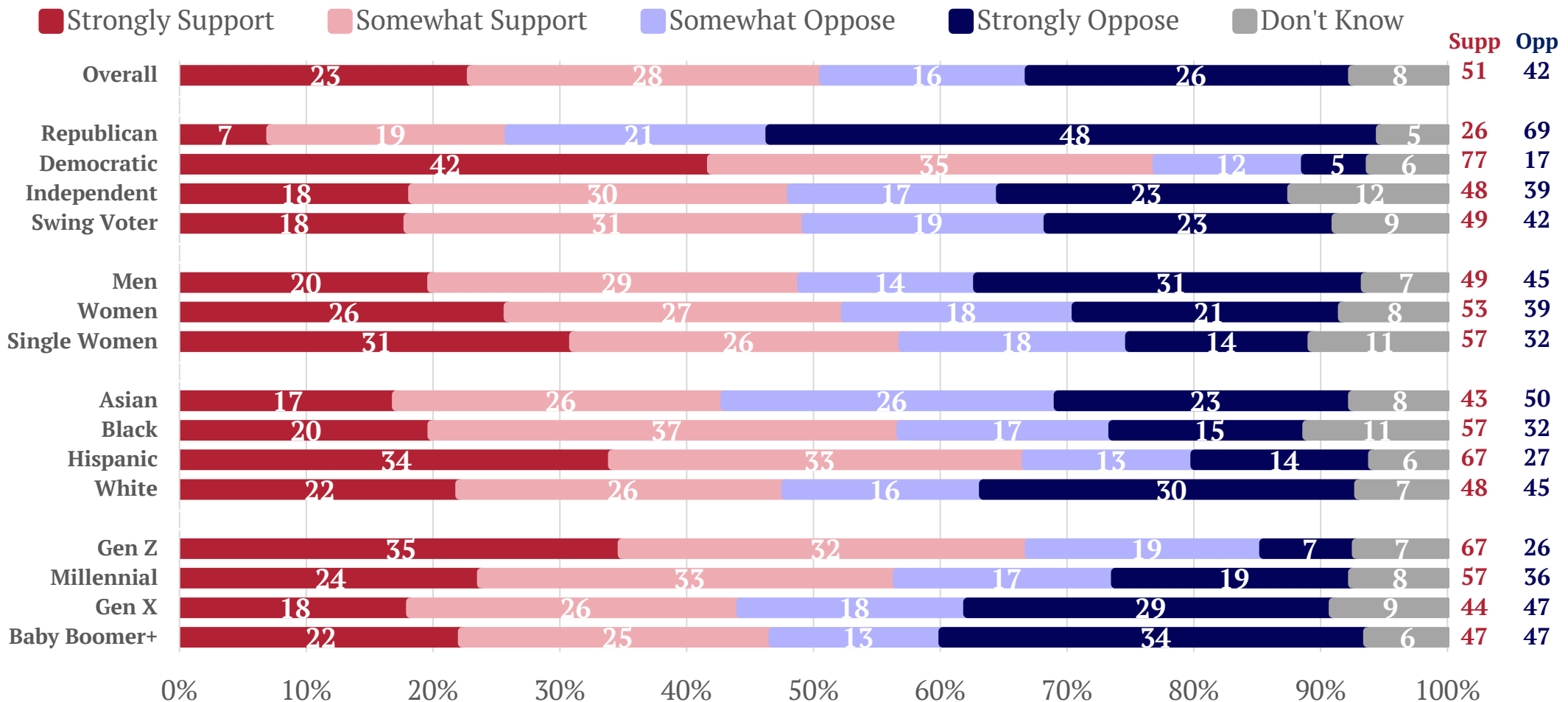

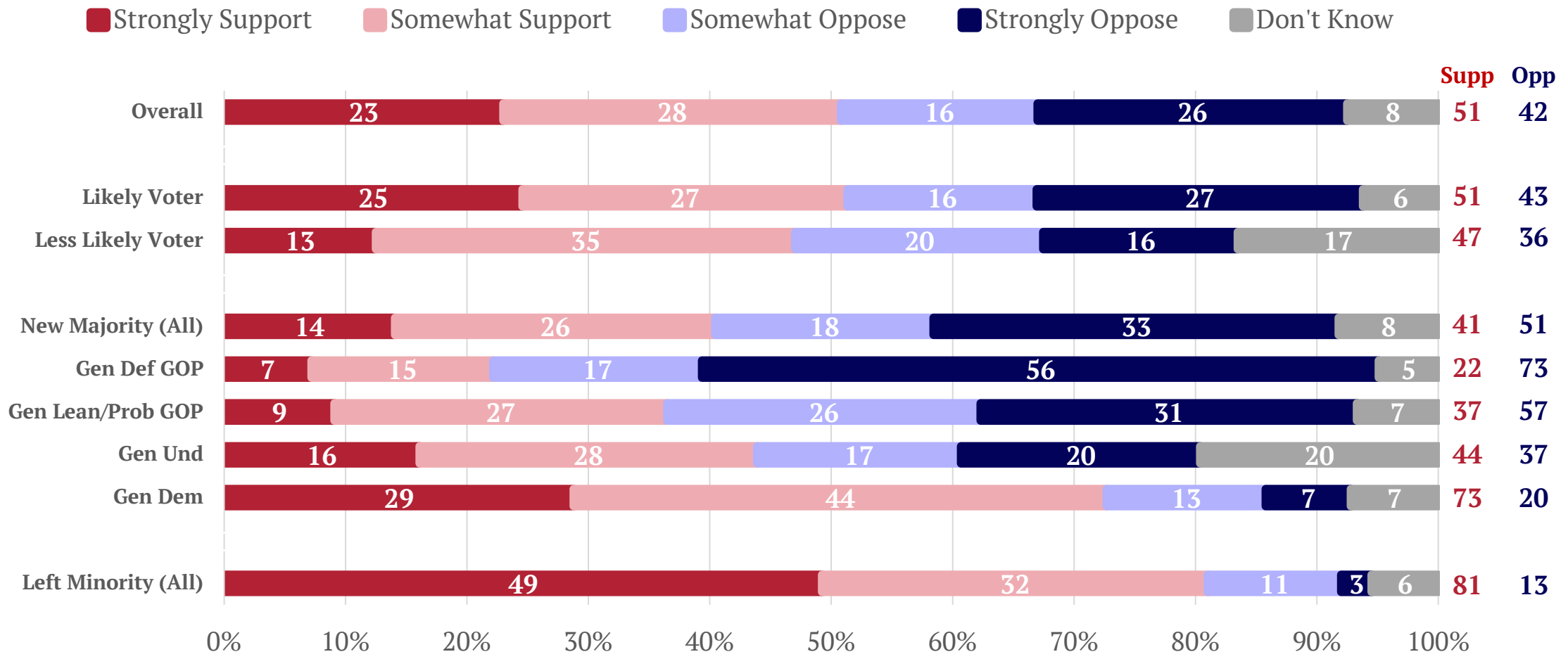
Half of Americans Support Amnesty Program for Illegal Immigrants Married to U.S. Citizens

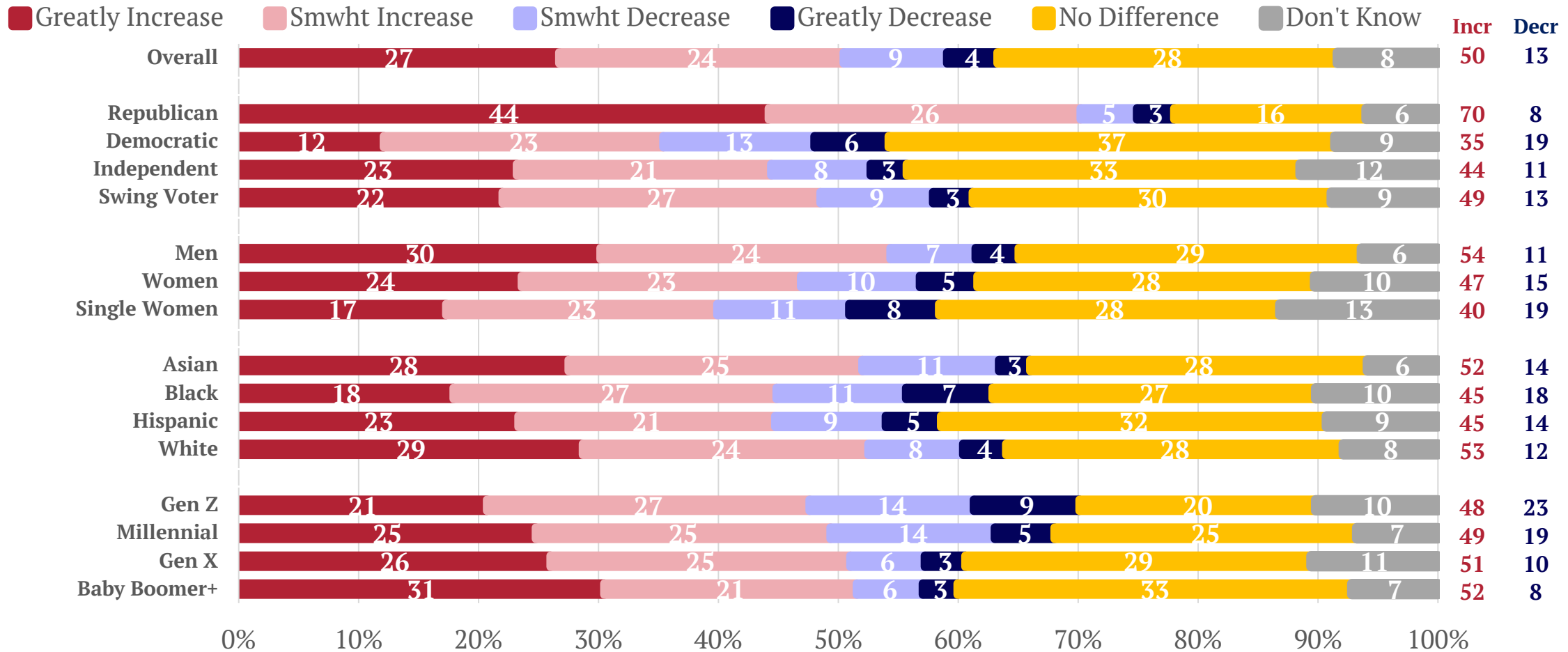

Half of Americans Agree Biden's Amnesty Program will Increase Illegal Immigration

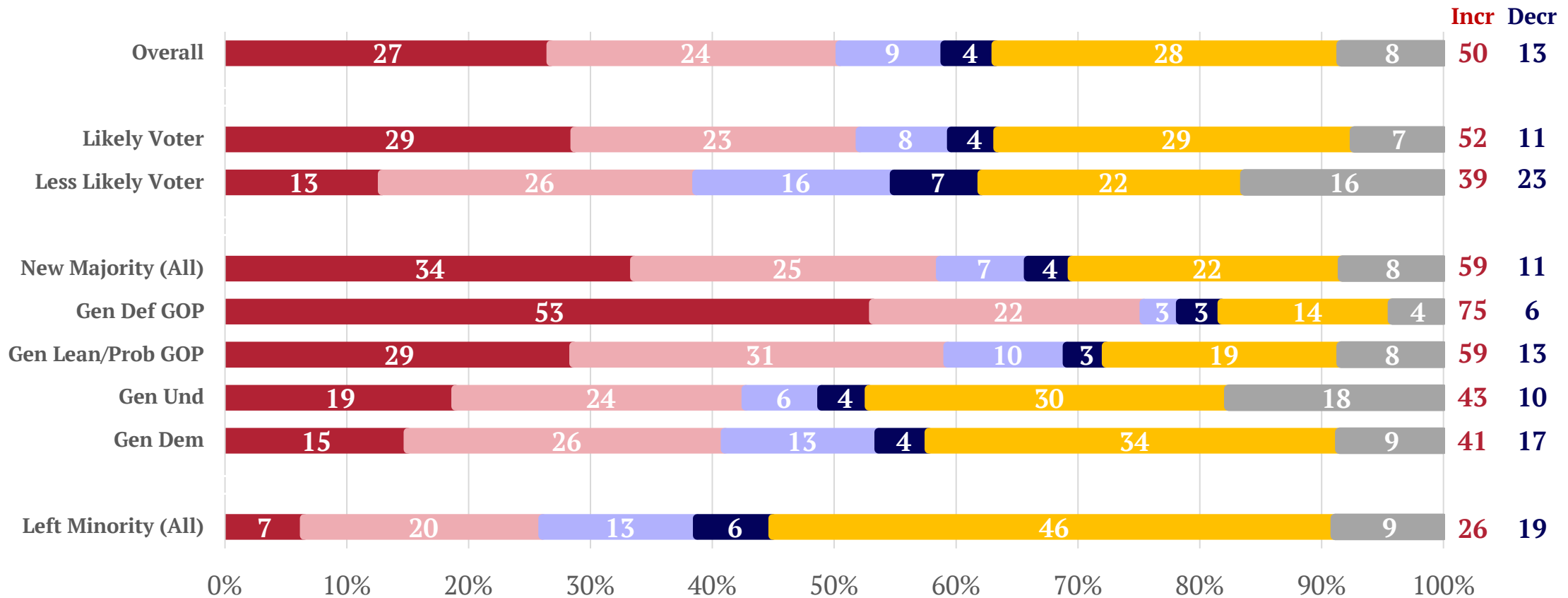

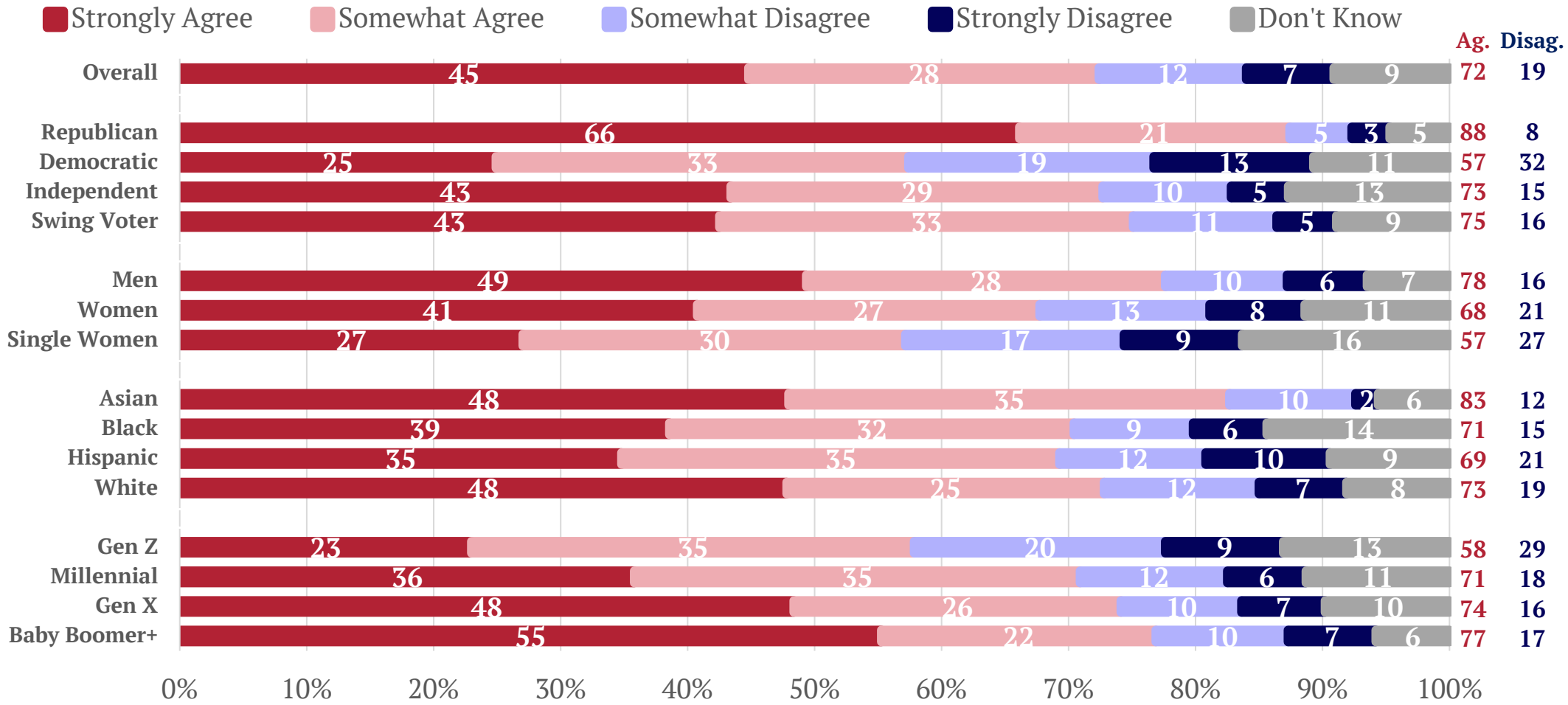


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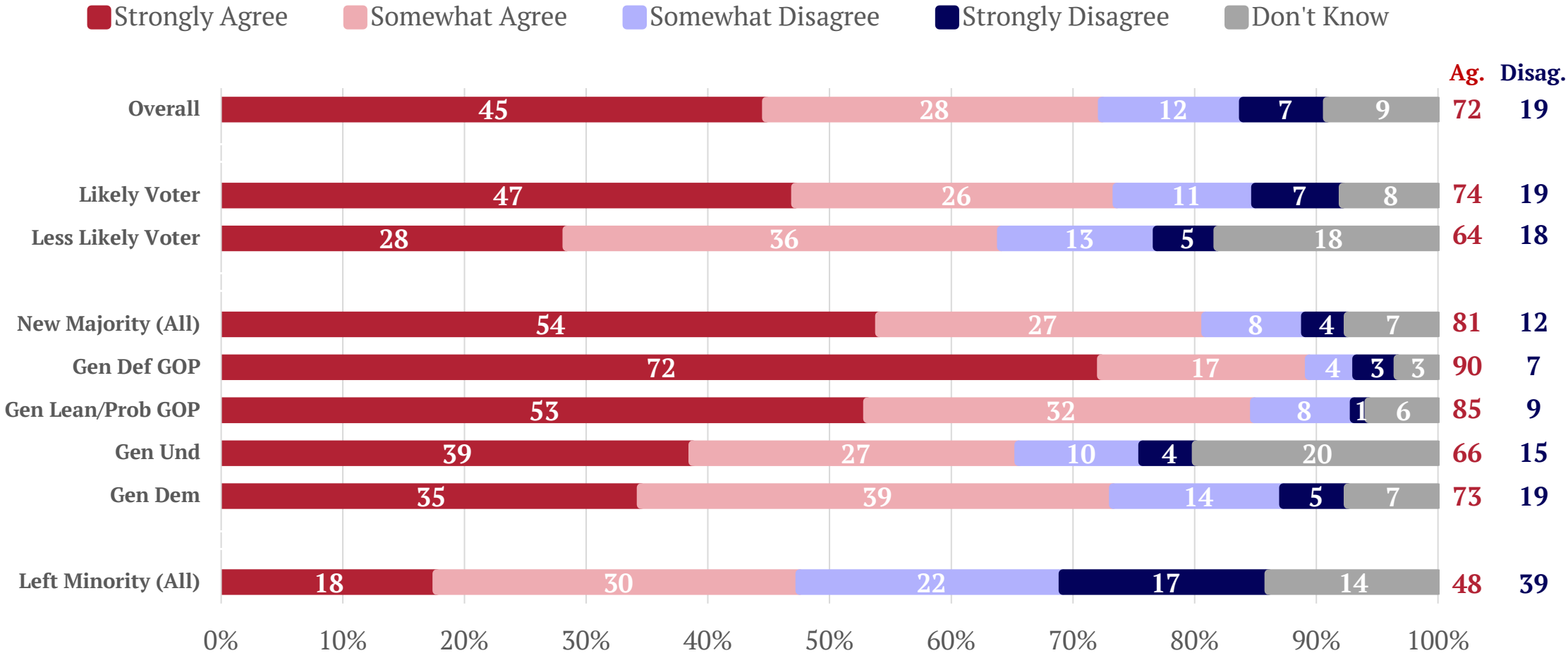
Nearly 3-in-4 Agree U.S. Should First Focus on Border Security and Fixing Its Immigration Laws

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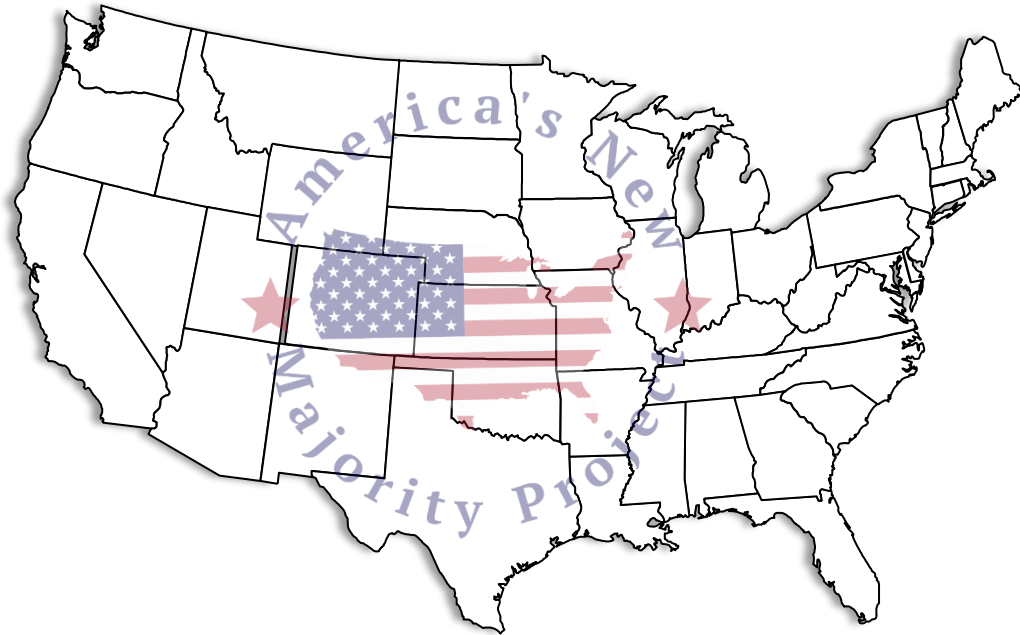


Methodology

Mclaughlin & Associates partnered with Gingrich360 to conduct a national survey for America's New Majority Project. This national survey was conducted among 2,000 registered voters between June 20-23, 2024.

All interviews were conducted online. Survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual general election turnout.

The sample of 2,000 registered voters has an accuracy of +/- 2.2% at a 95% confidence interval. The numbers in this presentation have been rounded and may not equal 100%.
